ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE DATED FEBRUARY 23RD, 1921, AMENDING THE ORDER DATED JANUARY 21ST, 1921, AS TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF SURVEYORS FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 20 AND 21 OF THE COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Coal Mines Act, 1911, under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that the Order of the 21st January, 1921, prescribing the qualifications of Surveyors for the purposes of the first-mentioned Act, shall be amended and supplemented by the addition thereto of the following further proviso:—

"And provided further that a person who, but for the revocation of the said Orders, would have been qualified to be a Surveyor in accordance with the provisions of the said Orders, and shall have so qualified before the 21st February, 1921, shall be deemed to be qualified in accordance with the provisions of this Order."

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED AND FIXED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS. Effective as from 28th February, 1921,* except where otherwise stated.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Order, 1919), having given due notice on the 22nd October, 1920, of Proposal to Vary General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers and to fix Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male and Female Workers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE VARIED such General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers set out in their Notice dated 18th June, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 17th June, 1920, and that THEY HAVE FIXED Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male and Female Workers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages, as Varied and Fixed, together with the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 18th June, 1920, which remain unaffected by this variation, are as shewn in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.
