Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presenta-tion to each of the following Benefices, namely, the Church and Cure (being a Rectory) of Grove, and the Church and Cure (being a Vicarage) of Wing, both in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford:

Whereas by the Will dated the 13th day of May, 1920, of the late Right Honourable Harriet Sarah, Baroness Wantage, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices was devised to the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which such Benefices were situate at the

time of her death:

"And whereas the said Benefices were at the time of the death of the said Harriet Sarah, Baroness Wantage, and now are situate in the

said Diocese of Oxford:

"And whereas Arthur Thomas Loyd, of Lockinge House, Wantage, in the County of Berks, Esquire, the Right Honourable David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Robert Henry Benson, of Number 26, Old Broad Street, in the City of London, Merchant, Guy Holford Benson, of Number 26, Old Broad Street aforesaid, Merchant, and Lady Jane Evelyn Lindsay, of Burcote Grange, Oxford, Spinster, are the Executors of the said Will in whom, but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowsons would now be vested and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Oxford in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:
"And whereas the Right Reverend Hubert

Murray, now Bishop of Oxford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, has executed this

Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Grove and Wing:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Arthur Thomas Loyd, The Right Honourable David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Robert Henry Benson, Guy Holford Benson and Lady Jane Evelyn Lindsay (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Baroness Wantage, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices shall be transferred to the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like

advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Oxford.

TATHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of January, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Beighton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Moulton (Saint Mary) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions. of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Beighton and Moulton (Saint Mary) duly made their report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recom-mended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the
