

Definition of Irish Animals Landing Place.

2. All that space at the Port of Liverpool situate partly in the county borough of Birkenhead and partly in the county borough of Wallasey which is coloured pink on the plan (No. 34734) sealed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the Ministry, is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish animals.

Definition of Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. All that space which is coloured blue on the plan referred to in Article 2 of this Order is hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Wharf for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and any Order of the Minister thereunder.
