The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 17th day of February, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Hythe, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 6th day of October, 1841, and published in the *London-Gazette* on the 21st day of December, 1841, a Chapelry District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Hythe, in the Parish of Fawley, in the said County of Southampton, and in the said Diocese of Winchester, and the said Chapelry District was named ‘The Chapelry District of Hythe’:

“And whereas the said Chapelry District of Hythe has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Hythe should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Hythe shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Dibden, in the said County and Diocese, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Hythe.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory to be dis severed from the Parish of Dibden, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Hythe, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

“1. All that portion of the said Parish of Dibden which is bounded on the south-east by the southern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe, upon the north-east by the middle of Southampton Water, upon the north-west by the northern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the northern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe from the said Parish of Dibden at the junction of the road leading past the south-eastern side of Hythe House with the Southampton Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the Southampton Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Hythe past the western side of Langdown Park to Hardley, and extending thence first south-westward, then southward, and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Butts Bridge upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Dibden from the southern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe.

“2. And also all that portion of the said Parish of Dibden which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the north-east by the northern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the northern portion of the said New Parish of Hythe from the said Parish of Dibden turns north-eastward along the middle of Jones's Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of such lane for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Southampton Road, and extending thence
