BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 and 1918.

In the Matter of Bernhardt Wineman.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that the Certificate of Naturalization numbered 15428 granted to Bernhardt Wineman on the 2nd August, 1905, is revocable under the provisions of Section 7 (2) (D) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Acts, 1914 and 1918, and that the continuance of the Certificate is not conducive to the public good:
