THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (COURTS OF REFEREES) (AMENDING) REGULATIONS, 1921, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920 (10 AND 11 GEO. 5, C. 2.).

Whereas the Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, has made the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) Regulations, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), for regulating certain matters with reference to the constitution and procedure of Courts of Referees.

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said Regulations.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations for amending the said Principal Regulations.

Amendments to Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations.

1. (1) At the end of the proviso to paragraph (1) of Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the words:—

“ Provided also that at any sitting of a court at which claims made by women as well as claims made by men are to be considered the court shall, if practicable, consist of a chairman appointed by the Minister and of one man and one woman drawn from the employers' panel, and one man and one woman drawn from the insured contributors' panel, but where a court is so constituted, a man drawn from either of the panels shall not have any right to vote upon the consideration of a claim made by a woman and a woman drawn from either of the panels shall not have any right to vote upon the consideration of a claim made by a man.”

(2) After paragraph (3) of Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

“(4) No member of a panel shall act as a member of a court during the consideration of a case in which he appears as the representative of the claimant or in which he is or may be affected, or in which he has taken any part as an official of an association or as an employer or as a witness or otherwise.”

(3) Paragraph (4) of Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations shall be re-numbered 3 as a separate Regulation.

(4) Paragraph (5) of Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations shall be omitted.

Additions to Principal Regulations.

2. After Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulation (that is, after Regulation 3 of the said Principal Regulations as amended by these Regulations), the following Regulations shall be inserted:—

“ 4. (1) Reasonable notice of the time and place at which a court will sit for the consideration of any claim shall be given to the claimant, and, except by consent of the claimant, a court shall not proceed to the consideration of any claim unless such notice has been given.

“(2) During the consideration by a court of any claim, the claimant, the insurance officer or his deputy, and any other officer of the Ministry of Labour that the Minister may direct shall be entitled to be present at the sitting of the court, and the claimant may be represented at the sitting of the court by any person, not being a counsel or solicitor, authorised by him, but for the purpose of discussing its recommendations the court may order all persons not being members of the court to withdraw from the sitting of the court.

“(3) The court may allow any person appearing to the court to be likely to be affected by the decision of the court to be

present during the consideration of a claim, but save as aforesaid there shall not be admitted to the sitting of the court any member of the public or the representative of any newspaper.

“ Provided that where the claim to be considered by a court is a claim for payment by an association which has made an arrangement under section 17 of the Act of a sum in lieu of unemployment benefit, the secretary of the association, or the secretary of the branch of the association through which the claim was made shall have the same rights as to notice, presence at the sitting of the court, and representation by another person, as are given to a claimant by these Regulations.”

Amendment to Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations.

3. Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations shall be renumbered 7.

Amendment to Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations.

4. There shall be substituted for Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations the following Regulation:—

“ 8. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) Regulations (Amended), 1921, and shall as amended come into force on the 29th day of March, 1921.”

Printing of future copies of Principal Regulations.

5. Where by these Regulations any Regulations or words are directed to be added to or omitted from the Principal Regulations or to be substituted for any other Regulations or words in the Principal Regulations, copies of the Principal Regulations printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after these Regulations come into force, may be printed with the Regulations or words added, omitted, or substituted as these Regulations require, and with the Regulations and paragraphs thereafter numbered in accordance with such direction; and the Principal Regulations shall be construed as if they had at the time at which these Regulations come into force been made with such additions or omissions.

Short Title and Commencement.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) (Amending) Regulations, 1921, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

2. The following operations when carried on in, or in association with, or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above:—

(a) The willowing, machining, breaking-up, scouring or putting down mixings of cotton waste;

(b) the collecting, sorting or grading of any of the materials or articles, other than cotton waste, specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 of the Appendix to the Trade

Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation Order), 1920;*

(c) The operations specified in paragraph 3 of the Appendix to the above-mentioned Order, other than those specified in subparagraph (a) above.†

3. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association

* *List of Materials and Articles:—*

Rags, waste paper, paper stock; woollen, worsted, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware; discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear); discarded textile articles; old ropes; used bottles or used jars.

† *List of Operations:—*

The ripping of worn clothes for rags; the picking of old ropes; the trimming of paper salvage; the washing of used bottles or used jars; the washing of used tins; the breaking of scrap metal; the drying of rabbit skins; the making or repairing of sacks or bags; the wil-

Provided that—

(a) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time between the ages of 16 and 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers payable during the first six months' period of employment shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour less than the proposed rates otherwise applicable as set out above. Such workers, on completing six months' employment in the trade, shall be entitled to the proposed rates applicable to their age as set out in the foregoing Table.

(b) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates payable during the first twelve months' period of employment shall be as follows:—

(i) During 1st three months of employment, 6d. per hour.

(ii) During 2nd three months of employment, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(iii) During 3rd three months of employment, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(iv) During 4th three months of employment, 8d. per hour.

The proposed General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to such workers on completing twelve months' employment in the trade shall be 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

SECTION II.—(a) The Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rates set out in Section I. are applicable to the workers specified therein as follows, that is to say: where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable.

(b) The Proposed Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers set out in Section I. are for the purpose of securing to workers employed on Piece-work a Minimum Rate of remuneration on a Time-Work Basis, and such workers shall be entitled to be paid at not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate applicable to a worker of her age as set out in Section I., in any case where her earnings on Piece-work are less than such sum.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On Saturday	4 $\frac{1}{2}$
On any other week-day	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the proposed Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the proposed Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(c) For all time worked on Sunday the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the proposed Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the proposed Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The proposed Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds 4 $\frac{1}{2}$, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are without prejudice to the payment of Overtime Rates after a lesser number of hours than those declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number in the trade, in cases where such lesser number of hours constitutes the number customarily worked in the establishment.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the beforementioned fabrics, *viz.*:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flags when made in association or in conjunction with handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-Linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bed-spreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:—

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, overlocking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes, if done by machine:—Thread-drawing, thread-clip-

ping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 16th April, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade Board (Great Britain), 7, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH APRIL 1921.)

IMPORTATION OF HORSES, ASSES,
AND MULES (GREAT BRITAIN)
ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Regulation of Importation of Horses, Asses and Mules into Great Britain.

1. No horse, ass, or mule, brought to Great Britain from any other country except Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, shall, subject to the provisions of Article 2 of this Order, be landed in Great Britain unless it is accompanied by a certificate of a qualified veterinary surgeon of the district in the country of origin whence the animal was brought, stating:—

(a) For purposes of identification the breed, age and sex of the animal;

(b) that the animal was examined by the veterinary surgeon immediately before it was moved to a port for shipment to Great Britain and that he found that the animal did not show symptoms of glanders (including farcy), epizootic lymphangitis, ulcerative lymphangitis, dourine, horse-pox, sarcoptic mange, psoroptic mange, influenza, ringworm, or strangles; and

(c) that the animal was tested by a veterinary surgeon with mallein within ten days before the date of shipment and did not react.

Special Provision for Race-horses, Polo-ponies, Performing animals and animals intended for exportation within 14 days.

2. In the case of an importation of any thoroughbred horse for the purpose of being run in a race, or of a trained pony for playing polo, or of a *bona-fide* performing animal, or an animal intended for exportation from Great Britain within fourteen days after landing, the information required in paragraph (c) of the preceding Article may be omitted from the certificate, provided that in all such cases the certificate shall be accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner or person in charge or consignor of the animal, stating (i) the estimated value of the animal, (ii) the name and address of the consignee in Great Britain, (iii) the address of the stables to which the animal is consigned, and (iv) that the animal is being imported for one of the above-mentioned purposes only.

Provisions as to Certificates and Declarations.

3. (1) Certificates and declarations required by this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(2) A certificate or declaration may refer to more than one animal, but the full particulars required thereon shall be clearly given in respect of each animal referred to in the certificate or declaration.

(3) The certificates and declarations required by this Order shall be delivered up on the landing of the animals referred to in the certificates by the person in charge of the animals to an Officer of Customs and Excise at the port of landing.

Power for Ministry to require Mallein Test on Arrival in Great Britain.

4. (1) For the purposes of preventing the introduction or spread of glanders or farcy, the Ministry may cause any horse, ass, or mule landed in Great Britain from any other country except Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man to be tested with mallein by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry at such time not later than fourteen days after the landing of the animal as the Ministry may think fit. The owner of the animal and occupier of the premises where the animal is located shall give all necessary facilities for such testing.

(2) Where in the opinion of the Veterinary Inspector the application of the test results in definite evidence of glanders or in indications of glanders not amounting to definite evidence of glanders, the animal shall be dealt with under and in accordance with the provisions of the Glanders or Farcy Order of 1920.

Revocation.

5. Chapter 1—Importation—of the Horses (Importation and Transit) Order of 1913 is hereby revoked.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. This Order shall, except where it is otherwise provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. If any horse, ass or mule is landed in contravention of this Order the owner and the person in charge of the animal, and any person causing or permitting the landing, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing where such animal is landed, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the animal is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

9. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTATION OF HORSES, ASSES, AND MULES (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1921.

Prohibition of Landing except for Slaughter within Certain Landing Places.

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(2) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, may after mid-day on the fourteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, be landed only at the landing places defined by Orders of the Minister as landing places for Irish animals at the ports of Birkenhead, Bristol, Glasgow and Manchester; but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(3) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(4) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be slaughtered therein within seventy-two hours after their landing.

Special Provisions as to Animals Destined for Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.

2. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order, shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Revocation.

3. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1921 (Nos. 5 and 6) are hereby revoked.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed as the case may be shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894.

The Minister of Transport requires all persons owning or having in their possession or under their control any horse or vehicle to which this Order applies, when so required by any of the persons hereinafter specified, to place the same at the disposal, absolutely or by way of hire as required, of that person who is hereby authorised to take possession of and use the same. The specified persons are:—

(a) Any Divisional Road Commissioner mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

(b) Any person authorised, in writing, by the Minister of Transport or any of the said Commissioners to take possession of horses or vehicles to which this Order applies.

2. The Arbitrator to determine in default of agreement the compensation to be paid for any horse or vehicle requisitioned under this Order shall in England and Wales be the County Court Judge and in Scotland the Sheriff of the district in which the owner of the said horse or vehicle resides, or a person appointed by them respectively.

3. This Order shall apply to all horses and road vehicles (whether horse drawn or mechanically propelled or drawn) in use or capable of being used for transport by road, except any horse or vehicle used for any of the following purposes, namely: Naval, Military or Air Force purposes, Postal, Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes or Medical and Veterinary purposes, or used wholly or mainly for the purpose of agriculture.

4. (a) Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the aforesaid regulations.

(b) This Order may be cited as the Road Transport Requisition (Ministry of Transport) Order, 1921.
