**FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.**

In pursuance of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under Section 116 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of that section, with modifications, to factories and workshops in which the Manufacture or Decoration of Pottery is carried on. Certain specified branches of the earthenware trade are excluded by the Order from its operation.
