**ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

**CHESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2. (1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable, for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

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SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District.

A District comprising—

The petty sessional divisions of Wirral, Chester Castle (*except the parishes of Lower Kinnerton, Dodleston, Pulford, Poulton, Eaton, Marlston cum Lache, Eccleston, and Saughton*), and Runcorn.

The Frodsham sub-division of the petty sessional division of Eddisbury, and

The parishes of Kingsley, Kingswood, Manley, Mouldsworth, Ashton, Horton cum Peel, and Barrow, in the administrative county of Chester; and

Such portions of the administrative county of Flint as lie to the north of the River Dee between Chester and the sea.

And also comprising—

The county boroughs of Birkenhead, Chester and Wallasey.

**ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1921 (No. 8).**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Landing at certain Landing Places of Cattle not intended for Slaughter.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1921 (No. 7), Cattle not intended for slaughter shipped from Ireland may, subject to the provisions of this Article, and not otherwise, be landed at any Landing Place for Irish animals described in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Cattle so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place until the expiration of fourteen days after the landing of the last animal at the landing place, and then only in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(3) The removal of any animal from the Landing Place must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(4) Each animal moved with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry shall be moved to a place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and isolated, under the super-
