SECTION I.—For Female Workers (other than those specified in Sections II., III., IV. and V. of this Part of this Schedule).

Provided that in lieu of the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates as set out in Columns II. and III. of this Section Female Weaving Learners as defined in Part V. of this Schedule shall receive during one (and not more than one) period of learnership which shall not exceed two months, a General Minimum Time-Rate as follows :—

Per Week of 48 hours.

(a) During employment in the period of four months from the date on which the variations set out in Column II. of this Section take effect 15s. 9d.

(b) During employment after the period of four months specified in paragraph (a) of this proviso ... 14s. 5d.

Provided that in cases where a Weaving Mistress has immediate responsibility for the instruction of not more than one Female Weaving Learner, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out above shall only apply where the Weaving Mistress is paid by the employer in respect of such responsibility the sum of not less than 5s. per week in addition to her own earnings on piece-work.
