

SCHEDULE. PART II.—*continued.*

SECTION V.—In the case of Single Spinners or Double Spinners (other than Orra (or Spare) Spinners), when the size of yarn used on a bobbin is greater than the normal size of yarn as specified in Section IV. above, the General Minimum Time-Rates shall be equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates, as set out in the preceding Section, with the addition of the following percentages:—

Size of Bobbin.	Percentage increases to be paid on the appropriate rates, as set out in Section IV. above, for sizes above the Normal Size of Yarn.
2½ in.	2 per cent. for every ½ lb. per spindle above 4 lbs.
2¾ in.	2 " " ½ lb. " " 5 lbs.
3 in.	1¼ " " ½ lb. " " 6 lbs.
3¼ in.	1¼ " " ½ lb. " " 7 lbs.
3½ in.	2 " " 1 lb. " " 8 lbs.
3¾ in.	2 " " 1 lb. " " 10 lbs.
4 in.	1½ " " 1 lb. " " 11 lbs.
4¼ in.	1½ " " 1 lb. " " 13 lbs.
4½ in.	1¼ " " 1 lb. " " 16 lbs.
5 in.	1 " " 1 lb. " " 22 lbs.
6 in.	1 " " 1 lb. " " 32 lbs.

(a) In respect of any intermediate size of yarn the percentage increase for the next higher size shall be paid.

(b) This scale supersedes all allowances previously made for size or twist. Nothing extra shall be paid for weft and no deduction shall be made for hard warp.

PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Time-work.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 8¾.

On Saturday, 4½.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notices J (5) and J (8) dated 22nd October, 1920, and 1st April, 1921, respectively, the Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of Hours worked by Male or Female workers Employed on Time-Work in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(b) For Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(c) For all time worked in any week, in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half except where a higher amount is payable under Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 8¾, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that in the case of those classes of

workers in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Burgh of Blairgowrie, the Burgh of Carnoustie or the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate proposed in Sub-Section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of 8¾ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable in respect of all hours worked on any such day in excess of nine hours.

Provided also that in the case of those classes of workers in the areas specified in the first proviso to this Section who, in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend only on five days a week, the Overtime Rate proposed in Sub-Section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of 8¾ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable on any such day in respect of all hours worked in excess of 9½ hours.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

The proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice a Female Weaving Learner shall be deemed to mean a Female Worker who is:—

(a) Definitely and effectively learning weaving under the immediate instruction of a Weaving Mistress; and

(b) Employed under conditions such that she shall cease to be employed on time work and shall be employed on piece-work at the earliest date practicable.
