MERSEY CONSERVANCY ACT.

I hereby give notice, pursuant to the 9th Section of the Act 5 & 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from the Bromborough Urban District Council, given pursuant to the provisions of the above mentioned Act, of their intention to carry out works on the foreshore of the River Mersey, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), We, the Bromborough Urban District Council, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Urban District of Bromborough in the County of Chester, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct at or upon the foreshore of the River Mersey at Bromborough in accordance with Plans and Sections deposited at the Office of the Mersey Conservancy, certain works, viz.:—

An outfall into the Mersey, consisting of a 21-in. dia. cast-iron pipe, bedded in concrete, the soffit of the pipe at the outlet being 10 feet below Ordnance Datum.

A storage tank of a capacity of 262,500 gallons, being five-eighths of the estimated ultimate diurnal flow. The overflow is fixed at 16 feet above Ordnance Datum, and a separate connection to the outfall pipe will permit of a portion (and, at times, the whole depending on tide level) of the overflow being discharged through the outfall pipe; and any surplus will be dealt with by other Pipes discharging on the foreshore.

A 30-in. dia. concrete tube sewer, from the Storage tank to New Chester Road at the Junction of Port Causeway in private property.

It is proposed to commence the construction of these works in connection with a Sewerage Scheme to be carried out in the Bromborough District so soon as the necessary sanction has been obtained from the Ministry of Health and the necessary arrangements made for a loan for the carrying out of the works.

The extent to which the proposed works project into the tidal waters of the River Mersey are shown in the before-mentioned plan and in the description of the proposed works accompanying same.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED PLACES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The several premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be places infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this third day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

SCHEDULE.

Description and Limits of Infected Places.

1. The lands and buildings at Horwich Farm, including the whole farm, in the occupation of John Taylor Turner, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
2. The buildings Draglow Meadows, Colshaw Moor Meadows, and the plant at Draglow Farm, in the occupation of Peter Vernon, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
3. The buildings and yard at New Field Farm, in the occupation of George Lomas, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
4. The lands and buildings at Haycrust Farm, in the occupation of Joseph Barnes, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
5. The Top Shippon and housecroft at Alstone Lee Farm Combs, in the occupation of Edward Hartle, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
6. The West Horderns Ground, in the occupation of Joseph Barnes, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
7. The buildings and land at Thornilee Farm Combs, in the occupation of Harry Brocklehurst, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
8. Dane Hay Buildings and pasture, in the occupation of William Barrett, in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the administrative county of Derby.
