Venice, Nov. 2. The feveral Reports we have had of an Engagement between the Venetian and Ottoman Fleets, prove at left to have had no o-therfoundation, then a Rencounter between 5 or 6 Venetian Ships with the like number of Turks, and the two Fleets appearing afterwards in fight of each other in the Waters of Andres; but the Captain Balla Mezzomerro avoided a Battle, and setired towards Scio; In the Fight between the Ships above-mentioned, the Turks are faid to have lost 7 or 800 men, and the Venetians not above 200, and that one of the Enemie's Ships, called Sultanes, was fo shattered, that she funk before the could get into Harbour; This Account comes by the topes and Maltele Galleys who arrived at Corfu the 19th of the last month in their return home, having left the Venetian Fleet in the Archipelago, where the Captain G. neral Molino intended to continue for fome time longer; One of the Popes Galleys had the misfortune to be cast away in bad Weather near Cape Coloma, and 300 men that were on board are lost with their chief Officers.

General Rabutin who commands in Transitivania, has been to visit all the contiderable Garisons in that Principality, and has posted a sufficient number of Troops on the Frontiers to secure the Country against the Enemies Excursions during the Winter. The Count de Herberstein, who commands at Caransebes, sent out a Party lately, who passed the Danube, and brought back several Pritoners, and a good Booty of Cattle; and another Party from the fame Garison has done the Enemy much mitchief in the Neighbourhood of Temeswaer; Furks have lately reinforced the Garison of Tem. swaer, which now confifts of 5000 Foot, and 700 Horse. The Letters from Turkey say, that at Constantinople they begin already to feel the enects of the taking of Ass by the Moscovires, which has opened a passage to the Cossicks to enter into the Black Sea, where they commit great Depredations, and have taken divers small Vessels going with Provisions to Constantinople. The States of Hingary are affembled at Buds to regulate the Winter Quarters for the Imperial Forces. The Officers are all ordered to recruit their Troops.
