of Longton, and the said District Chapelry was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint

John the Baptist, Lane End ':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of May, 1895, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Jude, Hanley':

"And whereas the said Particular District of Christ Church, Fenton, the said District Chapelry of Saint John the Baptist, Lane End, and the said District of Saint Jude, Hanley, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Lane End, and of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, should be altered in the manner which is here-

inafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Lane End, and the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent, the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, and the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Dane End, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parishes respectively, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or

of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lich-

field, being:—
"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south-east |

and upon the south by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, upon the west by the Parish of Stoke upon Trent, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, at the point near the junction of Fenton Road with Botteslow Road, where the boundary of the Civil Parish of Fenton crosses Fenton Road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the said civil parish boundary for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of Ley Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton.

"II. Also all that portion of the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent which is bounded upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, and partly by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, from the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent at the junction of Fenton Road with Botteslow Road, and extending thence first westward and then scuth-westward along the middle of Botteslow Road for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 26 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Fenton published in the year 1900 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map or Plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation from the close numbered 27 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to the said fence and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 26 and the closes numbered 59 and 57 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 27 and the closes numbered 56 and 154 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 57 from the said close numbered 154 meets the northern side of William Street, and extending thence first southwestward to and then south-eastward along the middle of William Street for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries William Street across the Biddulph Valley Branch Line of the North Staffordshire Railway upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stoke upon Trent from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton.

"III. Also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Fenton, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Lane End, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Lane End, from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, at the
