

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather or of polish for leather or furniture, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above;

including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

- (i) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;
- (ii) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling, packeting, labelling;
- (iii) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

In accordance with the Regulations with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 11th July, 1921, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

*Minimum Rates of Wages (as varied) for  
Female Workers in Retail Bespoke Dress-  
making effective as from 11th July, 1921.*

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 17th July, 1921.

##### *General Minimum Time-Rates.*

Fully qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (1) of the Schedule below, 10½d. per hour.

Qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (2) of the Schedule below, 9½d. per hour.

All other Female Workers (except Learners and Homeworkers), 8½d. per hour.

Homeworkers as defined in Part IV, Section 2 of the Schedule below, 8½d. per hour.

Learners employed under conditions laid down by the Trade Board. See Part I, Section 2 below.

##### *Piece-work Basis Time Rates.*

Fully qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (1) of the Schedule below, 11½d. per hour.

Qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Section 1 (2) of the Schedule below, 10½d. per hour.
