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Leghorn, November 12. N. S.

WE have advice, that 12 French Men of War are lately sailed from *Toulon*; some of which are cruising about *Sardinia* and *Corsica*. The *Rooke* Galley, with 5 or 6 other Fish Ships, are daily expected here.

Venice, Nov. 16. By a Vessel arrived here from the *Morcs*, we have an account, that the Ottoman Fleet is returned to *Constantinople*; and the Venetian Gallies to *Napoli di Romania*, and their Men of War to *Porto Spetia*; Some of the Ships that are most in want of repairs are shortly expected here to be refitted against the next Summer. The Senate have resolved to augment both their Fleet and Army, and have therefore given out Commissions for new Levies to be made this Winter, and several Men of War and Gallies are building in the Arsenal here. They write from *Turkey*, that the Grand Signior was returned from the Campaign to *Adrianople*, and after a short stay in that City, would go on to *Constantinople*, where he intends to pass the Winter.

Milan, Nov. 14. The Marquis de *Leganes*, our Governor, is returned hither from *Turin*. Most of the German Forces are marched out of the *Wilmarz*; Those commanded by my Lord *Galway* are likewise on their march, and are to pass through the Territories of the Republick of *Venezia*. Greatest part of the Spanish Troops, at present in this Country, will be sent to *Catalonia*, and a strong Reinforcement is likewise designed thither from the Kingdom of *Naples*, for the Service of the next Campaign.

Turin, Nov. 17. All the French Troops that were lately in these parts, have repassed the Mountains; Part of them are to have their Winter Quarters in *Provence*, and are probably deligned against *Catalonia* the next Summer; For which reason we hear the Spaniards are likewise going to reinforce their Army in that Country with the Troops of *Milan* and *Naples*. The French have strong Garrisons in the Citadels of *Pignarol*, *Nice*, and *Susa*, and the Fortress of *Montmelian*, which Places they say they are to keep till a General Peace is concluded; and we may very well believe they will have as little inclination to deliver them up then as they have now; so that they command the Country round these Garrisons as much as they did before. The Inhabitants of *Pignarol* cannot obtain to have their Town secured with a Wall, and have been told by the Governor of the Citadel, that they may spare themselves the trouble of making any Application for this purpose at the French Court, seeing if they do, he can assure them, it will not have the success they desire.

Madrid, Nov. 14. The King of *Spain's* Illness continues, having a little more or less of the Fever fit every day; Yesterday he was carried in a Sedan to his Devotions in his Chapel; The intended Bull Feast and Publick Rejoicings are put off for the present. The Queen is perfectly well. The Dutchess of *Frius* is made *Camarera Mayor* to her Majesty, in the place of the Dutchess of *Albuquerque* lately deceased. Here is a talk of Calling toge-

ther the Cortes or States of *Spain*. The Spanish Armada cruises still off *Cape St. Vincent*. They write from *Malaga*, that the *Aylmer* Frigate, was arrived there in 13 days from *Leghorn*, and reported, that Capt. *Fuller*, Commander of the *Panther*, had taken and carried into *Porto Longone* two French Ships bound to *Marseilles* from *Alexandria*; and that Capt. *Pickering*, in the *Charles* Privateer, had taken another French Ship worth 70000 Pieces of Eight.

Corunna, Nov. 25. N. S. Yesterday arrived here the Spanish-Alliance Pacquet Boat in 7 days from *Falmouth*, the Master whereof gives an account, that on the 11th and 12th of this month he saw near *Cape Ortigal* a Fleet of about 30 Sail, some of them very large Ships, and others Flyboats, Steering South-west.

Vienna, Nov. 17. The Imperial Forces that are coming back from *Italy* have Winter Quarters assigned them in *Bohemia* and *Cavintibia*, and the Emperor has resolved to employ the greatest part of them on the *Rhine* the next Campaign, and the rest in *Hungary*. The Letters from *Buda* of the 12th Instant say, several Regiments of Horse and Foot, who served in the Imperial Army this last Summer, were come into the Neighbourhood of that City, where they separated, and marched to their respective Quarters. Some of the Enemies Troops belonging to the Garison of *Belgrade*, were by our last Advices from *Peter-Waradin* in motion, and 'twas thought their design was against *Titul*, but that place is too well provided to apprehend the Consequence of any such Attempt in case the Enemy should intend it. The States of *Transylvania* have not only settled the Winter Quarters for the Imperial Forces in those parts, but have resolved to furnish Provisions for their Subsistence during the Winter. Their Imperial Majesties, who have passed some time at *Cloyster-Neubourg*, returned hither the 15th Instant, and are gone this day to *Ebersdorf*. The Elector of *Saxony* has taken Leave of them, and intends to depart hence to-morrow for *Dresden*.

Francfort, Nov. 25. The Hessian Troops are marching home, being to receive a Sum of Money of the States of the *Upper-Rhine* in lieu of Winter Quarters; and the Count de *Lippe*, who commands them, is gone to *Cassel*. Part of the *Palatin* Forces march towards *Hailbron*, and the rest go home. Here will be a meeting the next week of the Deputies of *Franconia*, *Suabia*, &c. and some of them are already arrived. Prince *Lewis* of *Baden* continues at *Gamsburg*.

Cologne, Nov. 27. An Officer who is employed by the Republick of *Venice* to raise Men for their Service, has written to the Magistrates of this City, to desire Leave to make Levies within their Jurisdiction, which they have granted. Some of the *Palatin* Regiments are on their march from the *Upper-Rhine*, to Winter in these Parts.

Hamburgh, Nov. 27. The Letters from *Warsaw* of the 15th Instant confirm the Account we had before of the Ravage which the Tartars made in their late Incurtion into the Country of *Lembergh*, and of their having carried away a great number of People. The Confederated Forces are come nearer to *Lembergh*, and lie within two miles of that City, raising Contributions upon all the Country round; Several Persons of Quality
