AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

ORDER FIXING SPECIAL OVERTIME RATES OF WAGES FOR THE CORN HARVEST IN WAR- WICKSHIRE.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice, as required by the above Act, that they have made the following order:—

(1) The differential rates of wages for overtime employment, whether on weekdays or on Sundays, payable to male and female workers employed on the Corn Harvest of 1921 in the area of the District Wages Committee for Warwickshire, shall during such time as they are so employed be as follows, in lieu of the overtime rates otherwise applicable to such workers under the Orders of the Wages Board for the time being in force:—

(2) For the purpose of this Order the expression "overtime employment" is defined to be:—

- all employment on a Sunday.
- all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday.
- all employment in excess of 8½ hours on any other day.
- all employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding Sunday).

(3) Provided that for the purpose of determining whether any particular employment is overtime employment regard shall be had to the total period of the worker's employment, whether such employment is on harvest work or otherwise.
