RABIES—continued.

Coate, to the boundary of the borough of Swindon; thence southerly along that boundary to the Midland and South Western Junction Railway, thence along that railway via Og-

bourne St. George to its junction with the first-mentioned railway near Savernake and thence along that railway to the point of commencement.

SHEEP SCAB.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Argyll.—1. An Area comprising the island of Coll.

2. An Area comprising the island of Tiree.

3. An Area comprising the islands of Colonsay and Oronsay.

4. An Area comprising the island of Iona.

5. An area comprising the holdings known as Auchenreir, Mill Farm, Rhugarbh, The Park and Glebe, Ferlochan, Culcharran, Auchnacreebeg and North Ledaig, in the parish of Ardchattan and Muckairn.

6. An area comprising the holdings known as Shellachan, Fanans, Barrachander and Achnacraoible, in the parish of Glenorchy and Inshail.

7. An area comprising the holdings known as Tullich, Glenbeg, Cuilfail, Kames and Duchra, in the parish of Kilninver and Kilmelfort, and the holding known as Turnault, in the parish of Craignish.

8. An area comprising the holding known as Callumkil, in the parish of Kildalton.

9. An area comprising the holdings known as Pole Farm and Lochgoilhead, in the parish of Lochgoilhead and Kilmorich.

10. An area comprising the holdings known as Rhonadale, Dippen, Lephincorrach, Kilmichael, Ifferdale, Whitestone, Duchran and Auchenreigh, in the parish of Saddell and Skipness, and the holdings known as Arnicle and Garbhalt, in the parish of Killean and Kilchemzie.

Bute.—An Area comprising the holdings known as Nether Ardrosedale, Ballycaul, Upper Ardrosedale and Dunalunt, in the parish of North Bute, in the county of Bute.

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

Kent.—The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex.

And also comprising:—

The county boroughs of Brighton, Canterbury, Eastbourne and Hastings.

Kincardine.—An Area comprising the farms of Tipperty, Bogburn, Denside, Honeybank, Mains of Glenfarquhar, Galloquhine, Drumelzie, Mains of Drumtochty, and Cosbald (including the hill grazings attached to the said farms), in the parish of Fordoun, in the county of Kincardine.

Perth.—An Area in the county of Perth, comprising the parish of Killin, and such portions of the parishes of Fortingall, Dull, and Kenmore as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the boundary of the parish of Killin on the North shore of Loch Tay and proceeding along that shore to Fearnan, thence following the Fortingall Road to the River Lyon Bridge, thence following the River Lyon to Coshievile, thence along the main road to Kinloch-Rannoch Village via Tummel Bridge, thence along the South shore of Loch Rannoch to the Dall Burn, thence following the course of the said burn to its source nearest the source of the Lairig a Mhuic stream, thence in a straight line to the source of that stream, thence following the course of that stream to the road leading from Fortingall to Glenlyon, thence following that road to the Bridge of Balgie, and continuing along the road from that bridge to Edramuchy to the point where it crosses the boundary of the parish of Kenmore, and thence along the westerly boundary of that parish to the point of commencement.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Sussex (East).—See under Kent.
