

of Chester and in the said Diocese of Chester, and the said Parish of Shotwick all meet, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Powey Lane for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Parkgate Main Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Parkgate Main Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the occupation road which leads past the north-western side of Big Wood towards Shotwick Park, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said occupation road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shotwick from the said Extra Parochial Place called Shotwick Park.

"II. And also all the said Extra Parochial Place called Shotwick Park."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of July, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Alberbury, situate partly in the County of Salop and partly in the County of Montgomery, and wholly in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said

Benefice of Alberbury is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Warden, and College of the Souls of All Faithful People, deceased, of Oxford, hereinafter called 'the said Warden and College':

"And whereas the said Warden and College are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Alberbury now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Martin Linton, now Bishop of Hereford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Alberbury which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Alberbury:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Warden and College (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Alberbury now vested in them, the said Warden and College as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
