PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for all Female Workers employed in Great Britain, excluding the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands, set out in their Notice dated 30th May, 1921, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 27th May, 1921, and to Vary the Over-time Rates for Female Workers employed in the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands, set out in their Notice dated 4th November, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 2nd November, 1920, the pro-Variations being as shown in Schedule set out below.

Female Workers Employed in Great Britain other than those specified in Part II.

Section I.—Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers other than those employed in the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands.

Proposed Variations.

Workers under 15 years of age, from 13s. to 12s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 3d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 17s. to 16s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 4d. per hour,

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 21s. to 20s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 5d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 26s. to 25s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., $6\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, from 32s. to 30s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per

Provided that:-

(a) The Proposed Minimum Rate for Workers of 16 and under 18 years af age who have had less than six months' experience in the laundering of articles of any description or the processes and operations incidental thereto in any laundry which is carried on by way of trade or for the purpose of gain or carried on as ancillary to another business shall

Proposed Variations.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 17s. to 16s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 4d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 22s. to 20s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 5d. per hour..

Proposed Minimum Rate for (b) The Workers of 18 years of age and over who have had less than 12 months' experience in the branches of trade specified in paragraph (a) above shall be ..

Proposed Variations.

During the period of employment required to complete the 1st Six Months of such experience, from 26s. to 25s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., $6\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour.

During the period of employment required to complete the 2nd Six Months of such experience, from 29s. to 27s. 6d. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, $6\frac{7}{8}$ d. per hour.

Section II.—Proposed Variation of Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers other than those employed in the Administra-tive County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands.

Proposed Variations.

Female Workers (all ages), from 92d. to 9d. per hour.

Section III.—Proposed Variation of Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-Workers other than those employed in the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands.
