

Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

(2) Part III. of that Order is hereby applied to the Scheduled District described in the Staffordshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.

(3) The provisions of Article 2 of the Staffordshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

3. This Order may be cited as the STAFFORDSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Staffordshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.
