

SECTION II.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers.

Female Workers of all ages, 9½d. per hour.
(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, see Section II (a) of Part V of this Notice.)

SECTION III.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers in this section of the Trade, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, are as set out in Part III of this Notice.

SECTION IV.—For the purpose of this Notice the Woollen Rag or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials Section of the Trade is defined to be that Section of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Notice which is engaged in:—

(a) The sorting or grading of Woollen Rags or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials in or in connection with any establishment or business, or branch or department.

(b) The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations referred to in clause (a).

C.—All Sections of the Trade Defined in Part IV of this Notice other than those Sections Specified in "A" and "B" of this Part of this Notice.

SECTION I.—Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers.

(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Guaranteed Time-Rates, see Section I of Part V of this Notice.)

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates.

- Workers of 14 and under 14½ years of age, 14s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3½d. per hour.
- Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age, 15s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3¾d. per hour.
- Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4¼d. per hour.
- Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 19s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4¾d. per hour.
- Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5d. per hour.
- Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5½d. per hour.
- Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.
- Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 26s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6½d. per hour.
- Workers of 18 years of age or over, 28s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7d. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards, and under 18 years of age, the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age, as set out in the foregoing Table, shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

SECTION II.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Piece-Workers.

Female Workers of all ages, 8d. per hour.

SECTION III.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers in this section of the Trade, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, are set out in Part III of this Notice.

PART II.

Male Workers of 21 Years of Age or Over.

SECTION I.—Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers of 21 years of age or Over.

(a) Who are employed in that branch of the trade specified in Part IV of this Notice which is engaged in the collecting, sorting, grading, or breaking of scrap iron or other scrap metal where the collecting, sorting or grading of other waste materials is not carried out to a substantial extent in connection therewith, 53s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. 1¼d. per hour.

(b) Who are employed in any other branch of the trade specified in Part IV of this Notice, 48s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. per hour.

SECTION II.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The proposed overtime rates for male workers of 21 years of age or over are set out in Part III of this Notice.

PART III.

Overtime Rates. Male Workers of 21 Years of Age or Over and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

	Hours.
In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday) ...	8¾
On Saturday	4¼

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays, on Customary Public Holidays, or on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over, or by a Female Worker, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

1. On any day other than Sundays, Customary Public Holidays and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

2. On Sundays, on Customary Public Holidays, and on Statutory Holidays:—For all time worked, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-Time.

3. In any week:—For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as
