WHEREAS the Minister of Health has, in virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Local Government Act, 1888, and the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, made Regulations amending the County Stock Regulations, 1891, 1897 and 1901:

And whereas the said Regulations have, as required by the said Local Government Act, 1888, been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either House that such Regulations ought not to be proceeded with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said Regulations (copy whereof is hereunto annexed) into consideration, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to confirm and doth hereby confirm the said Regulations.

AMENDING REGULATIONS REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the County Stock Regulations, 1921, and shall be read as one with the County Stock Regulations, 1891, 1897 and 1901, and these Regulations and those Regulations may be cited together as the County Stock Regulations, 1891 to 1921.

2. Where stock has been issued at a price lower than one hundred pounds stock for one hundred pounds sterling, so much of the stock as represents the difference between the price of the stock as issued and its nominal value shall for the purposes of Article 11 of the County Stock Regulations, 1891, and of Article 3 of the County Stock Regulations, 1897, be treated as a loan authorized by a statutory borrowing power and repayable on or before the date at which the stock is first redeemable at par at the option of the Local Authority, and those Articles shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. Paragraph 3 of Article 11 of the County Stock Regulations, 1891, shall have effect as if the words "on or before the date at which the stock is first redeemable at par at the option of the local authority" were substituted for the words "within the period within which the stock is to be extinguished" at the end of that paragraph.

4. The words "or at such other value as the Minister of Health may direct" shall be in-

serted after the words "at par value" in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (2), and after the words "at par" in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (3), respectively, of the proviso added to Article 12 of the County Stock Regulations, 1891, by Article 2 of the County Stock Regulations (Amendment), 1901.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Basil John Petrochilos.
Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that the certificate of naturalization numbered 21,989 granted to Basil John Petrochilos, on the 21st May, 1912, is revocable under the provisions of Section 7 (2) (d) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and that the continuance of the certificate is not conducive to the public good.

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate; and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof; and I further order the said certificate to be cancelled.
