The following Agreement for the reciprocal notification by the British and Swedish Governments of certain particulars regarding lunatic Swedish subjects in the United Kingdom and British subjects in Sweden has been concluded by a recent exchange of Notes between the two Governments, and came into operation on the 21st ultimo:—

AGREEMENT.

Article 1.—When a ^{British} ~~Swedish~~ subject in Sweden becomes mentally deranged his confinement in an Asylum or his discharge from such an establishment or eventual death shall be notified to the British Legation at Stockholm Swedish Government by His Britannic Majesty's Representative at Stockholm.

Article 2.—The notifications mentioned in Article 1 must mention the name of the asylum where the lunatic is confined, and, if possible, contain the following details of information regarding the patient:—

1. Name and Christian names.
2. Date and place of birth.
3. Rank or profession.
4. Place of residence at the time of confinement in the lunatic asylum.
5. Last place of residence in the country of origin.
6. Names and Christian names, etc., of the parents, or, if they are deceased, of the nearest relatives, mentioning their place of residence.
7. If the patient is married, name and Christian name of ^{his wife} ~~her~~ ^{her husband} ~~his~~ indicating ^{her} ~~his~~ place of residence.
8. Date on which the patient was confined in the asylum, or on which he was discharged from it, or on which he died there.
9. Name of the person on whose petition the patient was confined in the establishment.
10. If the admission followed in consequence of a medical report, the date of this report as

well as the name and place of residence of the doctor.

Article 3.—In all cases where the ^{Swedish} ~~British~~ Government demands the repatriation of a ^{British} ~~Swedish~~ subject suffering from mental derangement, the demand shall be accompanied by a notification containing the information specified in Article 2.

Article 4.—When a ^{British} ~~Swedish~~ subject, suffering from mental derangement, is repatriated, the patient's medical dossier kept at the asylum shall be communicated to the competent ^{British} ~~Swedish~~ authorities.
