GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 12) ORDER, 1921, DATED 29TH SEPTEMBER, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the German Reparation Recovery (No. 12) Order, 1921.

2. Any Article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any Article in regard to which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise that after being consigned to Germany by a per-

son or persons not resident in Germany it is thence consigned to the United Kingdom, provided that the said Commissioners are satisfied that it has not undergone any process of manufacture in Germany, and has not whilst in Germany passed out of the ownership of the person or persons by whom it was consigned thereto.
