The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Bangor on the 13th day of April, 1920, agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon, on the 24th day of March, 1921, petitioned His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the Boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 22nd day of April, 1921, to refer the said petition of the said Council of the Borough of Bangor to a Committee of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 27th day of May, 1921, to approve the Report of the said Committee, to the effect that, no petition having been presented against a compliance with the prayer of the said petition of the said Council of the Borough of Bangor, within the time limited by Statute in that behalf, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner in accordance with the provisions of the said Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did by warrant, given under his hand and seal at Whitehall on the 15th day of July, 1921, appoint Samuel Pope, Esquire, Barrister at Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said appointment, prepared the following Scheme, dated the 5th day of September, 1921, accordingly:

"BOROUGH OF BANGOR.

"Scheme for the alteration of Ward Boundaries made in pursuance of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893.

"Article I.—For the purposes of the Election of Councillors, the Borough shall continue to be divided into Four Wards, which shall

continue to be termed respectively, the North or Upper Bangor Ward, the South or Town Ward, the East or Hirael Ward and the West or Glanadda Ward.

"Article II.—Each of the said Wards shall comprise the portion of the Borough indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the Ward on the maps, each marked 'Map of the Wards of the Borough of Bangor as altered 1921,' which are signed by me as constituting an integral part of this Scheme and annexed hereto the boundary of each ward being clearly delineated and set forth thereon. One of the said maps shall be sent herewith to the Secretary of State to be submitted by him to His Majesty in Council for approval, and the other shall be deposited with the Town Clerk of the Borough. In the event of any discrepancy between the map and the textual description, the ordnance survey map (Edition of 1920) shall prevail.

"Article III.—The Boundaries of the said Wards in terms of description shall be as follows:—

"THE NORTH OR UPPER BANGOR WARD.—Commencing at the most westerly point of the Borough Boundary on the Menai Straits near the George Hotel, thence following the line of the Borough Boundary southward to the boundary of the West or Glanadda Ward in the centre of Ffriddoedd Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Ffriddoedd Road as far as the fenced path on the south side leading to the Railway cottages, thence southward along the centre of the said path to a point above the tunnel of the London and North Western Railway Line which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of the said Railway Line, thence eastward along such prolonged line and the centre of the said Railway Line as far as the Bangor Railway Station to a point which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of Deiniol Road, thence along the said line and the centre line of Deiniol Road and Garth Road to the junction of Garth Road and Beach Road, thence along the centre of Beach Road to the river Adda, thence along the river Adda to the Sea and thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the Borough Boundary at low-water mark and thence following the line of the Borough Boundary northward and westward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"THE SOUTH OR TOWN WARD.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Garth Road near Number 5 Erw Fair which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of
