Vienna, Dec. 22. Most of the General Officers that ferved in the Imperial Army in Italy, are come hither, but have fent their Equipages towards German, where they will be employed the next Campagne; Part of the Imperial Troops, which return from the Milaneze, are arrived within the Emperor's Herdisary Territories, and the rest follow. The Prince of Fandi, who affifted on the Emperor's part in the Negociation about the Neutrality of Italy, is on his return, and expected here in few days. Count Guido of Staremberg is arrived here from Effeck, and has given the Emperor an account of the good postare he left things in on the Frontiers, which, by the Care that's taken, are fufficiently secured a. gainst the Enemies Excursions during the Winter. The Letters from Turkey fay, the Grand Signior has declared that he will go into the Field again the next Summer, and that he has fent to the Bassa's of the several Provinces to raise all the Men they can for the War; The fame Advices add, that the Turks are very much allarmed by the great Preparations of the Moscovites, and do particularly apprehend the Depredations they may commit on the Black Sea, for which purpose the Czar has caused about 100 small Vessels to be built. The States of Sil sia are now assembled, to raise Money for the War. Count Harrach, whom the Emperor is fending to Spain, to take care of his Interests at that Court, will set out the next week. Some of Prince Lewis of Baden's Servants are already arrived, and he is shortly expected.

Francfort, Dec. 30. The Deputies of the Six Circles assembled here, continue their Conferences with great application, and it's not doubted but their Project of Establishing an Army of 40000 Foot and 20000 Horse and Dragoons, for their Defence both in times of War and Peace, will have the defired effect. The Elector of Mentz. and Landtgrave of Hesse-Cassell have taken all posfible care to fecure the Bergstrass, and those parts, against any design the French may have on that fide; and fince the Duke of Wirtembergh (formerly Administrator) who commands in Prince Lewis of Baden's absence, continues ill, General Thungen, Governor of Meniz, is appointed to command the German Troops posted in the Lines that have been lately cast up for security of the Country, and he will repair thither upon the first notice of the Enemies motion.
