BUTTON-MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN)

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS.

Effective as from 17th October, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 23rd October, 1921.

General Minimum Time-Rates. Male Workers.

I. Workers of 21 years of age and over employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), 1s. 2d., 1s. 3d. or 1s. 3\frac{3}{4}d. per hour (according to length of experience).

II. All other male workers of 21 years of

age and over, 1s. 1½d. per hour.
III. Workers under 21 years of age (according to occupation and ages). See Part I. of the Schedule below.

Female Workers.

I. Workers of 18 years of age and over,

 $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

II. Workers under 18 years of age (according to age). See Part I. of the Schedule below.

Section I.—For Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes),

1s. 73d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $7\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour to an ordinary Male Worker (i.e., a male worker of ordinary skill and experience in these processes).
SECTION II.—Female Workers (other than

Home Workers), 83d, per hour.
In the case of all Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 81d. per hour to an Ordinary Female Worker (i.e., a female worker of ordinary skill and experience in the circumstances in question).

PART III.

Overtime Rates.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates set out in Section II of this Part of this Schedule the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:-

... 48 In any week On Saturday

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.
