

on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part II of the Notice Z. (8) issued by the Trade Board, dated 12th November, 1920, shall apply as respects those classes of workers to whom this Notice applies in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice Z. (8), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

SECTION II.—The Trade Board propose to provide that in the application of the Overtime Rates fixed by them, the following condition shall apply—

Where a worker is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the Overtime Provisions made by the Board and set out in the above-mentioned Notice Z. (8) the word "Saturday" were substituted for Sunday and the word "Sunday" for Saturday.

PART III.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male or female workers of the classes specified above in respect of all time during which they are employed in the trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, as set out in Part V of the Board's Notice Z. (8), dated 12th November, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Proposed Minimum, that is to say Lowest, Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 15th October, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
