Falmouth, Decemb. 21.

He 16th inftant is faid to have been caft away near the Lizard a Ship of Middlebourg called the Emperer Maximilian of 400 Tuns, and 20 Guns, from Lisbon, laden with Salt, Sugar, Tobacco, and other commodities, to a confiderable value, bound for Amsterdam, she being the fourth ship that hath within these 14 dayes perished about that place.

On Tuesday last came into this Port two Ships of London homewards bound with Wines from the Canaries ; yesterday morning they put again to sea with a favorable wind.

Here are still in Port two or three Dutch Ships, and some few English, outward bound, expecting a fair gale.

Rome, Dec. 8. On Friday laft, the Pope followed by a Train of the Princes and Nobility on horieback gave a vifit to the Queen of *Swedeland* at her Pallace of *Longara*, who received him at the foot of the flairs on her knees, kiffing his Robe, leaving the Guard and attendance : of the Pallace to the Popes Guards and Servants, after an hours flay and a view taken of her Gallery, he returned to the Quirinal, and the fame evening fent her another large prefent of Fowl, with feveral Ornaments of value.

On Sunday in the afternoon, Segnior Prior Bichi, Ambaffador Extraordinary of obedience from the Great Duke of *Tufcany*, made his Entry into this City in Cardinal Refpiglioft's Coach, followed by a Train of about 70 others with fix Horles, of the Cardinals, Ambaffadors, Princes, Prelates, and other great perfons about Town, and the fame evening went incognito to kils His Holinels foot, afterwards privately vifiting the Cardinal Nephew and Bali Rofpigliofi.

On Wednelday morning, the lame Amballadour, followed by a numerous Train of Coaches, filled with Prelates and feveral perfons of the Nobility, came to his first publick Audience, in which, affisted Cardinal Rospigliof, with eight others of the fame Colledge, and the fame afternoon began fits visits to the Queen of Sweden, the Cardi--nal Dean, and the rest of the Colledge, according to cultome.

The business of this formal Embaffie being over, he is to continue here as Ordinary Ambasisdour.

The Pope continues If ill zealous for the affiftance of the Republick of *Venice* in the defence of *Candia*, and is confulting by what methods he may beft raile and maintain 4000 men for that fervice.

From Naples, Letters of the 4th inftant inform us of the arrival in that Port of two Dutch men of war with one Merchant fhip.

' Genous Dec. 12. The 7th inflant in the morning failed hence the Frincefs for the Coaft of Spain with a fair wind. The Prince of Monaco endeavours to fecure his Towns upon the Sea-coafts, and hath p anted 2 or 3 Batteries with great Guns at Mentone.

From Milan we are told that the 28th paft the German Infantry were drawn up, and muftered, and fome few days fince the Count Galeazzo Trotti, the Camp-Mafter General, by order from the Marquis de Mortara the Governor, took a view of all the Italian Cavalry witch were drawn together at their Rendezvous nere Pavia. The Governor is refolved to referve only 400 horfe of all thole which have beentraifed fince the year 166. the choice of them is referred to the Captains, who are to take care only to retain fuch as have by theit long fervices grown moft expert in Militaty affairs, or have by any fignal fervice merited from the Publick. Twenty men are to be reformed out of each Troop of German horfe, but are to be difinisfed with their horfes and Arms; and all the Companies of foot to be reduced to 60 men apiece.

By order of the Archbishop, the Cardinal Lina, a folemn Procession has been made of all the Clergy, both Secular and Regular, with a great multitude of people, for imploring a bleffing upon Christendom; especially in relation to the future Election of a King in Poland, and the fuccess of the Wars in Candia : and by the Popes Command, the Sacrament is for 15 days together exposed in all the principal Churches of Milan. Some days fince the Sieux de Si, Andre, French Ambassiador to the Republick of Venice, passed in boat through the State of Milan upon the Po, but make, fome stop upon the way to take a view of the Fortress of Cassia.

From Turin they tell us that the Duke of Savoy having taken a view of the Fortifications of Vercelli and Verrua, which he finds much advanced to his fatisfaction, is again, returned to Turin,

The 26th past the Duke and Duchels of *Savoy*, with the young Prince, attended by most of the principal performs of their Court, went to the Church *della Confolata*, to perform a Vow formerly made by them for the recovery of the young Prince during his last fickness 3 where having folemnly performed their Devo ions, they offered a Statue of filver of the bignels of the young Prince, with a Heart of Gold, and a rich Crofs of Diamonds.

Bruffels, Des. 28. The Sieur de Fierlands, lately arti-ving here in order to his Entry upon his charge of Chancellour of Brabant, was the next day at his Lodging vifited and complimented by the Council of Brabant in a body. On Thursday last, he took his place in that Council, and was received with much ceremony and demonstration of joys the Sunday following he came to the Town-houfe, where the Effates of Brabant being Affembled, was felemnly received into his place as Chancellour, and took the oath according to cuftom 5 after which, the States delivered to him the Seals, which they would never be induced to do to his predeceffors as not being a Native of Brabant ; and the next day was with much respect received into the Council of State, then meeting at the New Chamber in the Palace, where was alfo prefent at the folemnity Monfieur Hovines the Chief Prefident, who has for some time been diverted from his attendance by a defluxion upon his eyes.

On Saturday laft, the Conftable of Caffille from Malin? fignified his diffatisfaction with this City upon their diffuting the reception of a Spanish Garrison, which he had often, but hitherto in vain moved, withal, declaring his refolution nor to make this his place of refidence, till the City would comply with his defires 3 fince which, the Commons have been affembled, where the bufinels has been debated, but as yet they continue firme to their refolutions, rather on the contrary, prefling for the removal of those which are now quartered in the Town. On Thursday last, about 600 people, most of them Gardeners living without the Town, came some the complaints against the foldiers belonging to the Count de Monterey, who without any respect to them as Citizens, bearing their thares in all common Dutles and Taxes, had notwithstanding committed several violencies on them, and robbed them of their Goods.

On Monday arrived here the Baron d' Ifold from Matines, where is also arrived the Count d'Egmont, and many of the Nobility, the fear of the Infection being wholly extinguished.

For Lille we are told, that the Governour has ordered the Suburbs to be pulled down, though but lately repaired by the Citizens; and has given the fame Order for all Houles which are any thing confiderable, within an hours riding from that place. The French Commissioners continue high in their Pretensions, and have lately offered at a new Project for exchange of places, but this found no entertainment, our Commissioners having no instructions but o. ely to treat about limits.

'Tis faid the French are builly providing for action, and have bought 6000 Mulquetoons at Liege, to be diffributed amongst their Horfe. At Tournay they are buse in advancing their new Cittadelle, and have pulled down about 300 Houles, to make a place of Armes; and have drawn about 12000 men between that and Lille, for the fecurity of both placet.

Paris, Deç. 28. On Tuckday laft His Majefty went to Verfailles, having before his departure conferred the Offace of Poff-Mafter-General upon the Margun's de Lour y, with an allowance of 36 thouland Livres yearly; and befides his bointy to other perfons, was pleafed to beflow upon the Count de Comminges a Prefert of 20 thouland Crowns, in confideration of the great fervices done by him upon feveral occafions.

A Courtiet from Spain paffing by this place for Flanders, has brought to Don Quinones a Jewel of confiderable value, intended by the Queen Regent as a Prelent to the Duke of Anjou, at whole Baptilme the has deputed to affult in her place as Godmother, Little Madam; and 'tis believed the Emperour will follow the fame Method for the fappily of his place at the fame Ceremony, without employing hither his Ambafladour.

Prince George of *lanemark* is returned hither from Blois, and lodged at the Houle of Monsieur Gabel, intending to pass the Winter here *incognito*.

Monfieur de Patovilles an Abbot of Franche Comte, emploied hither about the affairs of Befançon and the whole Province, during the Treaty at Aiz la Chappelle; being lately returned hither from Flanders, is (ecured and committed to the Baffille, but the reason of it not publickly said.

The Chevalier de Rohan, Son to the Prince de Guimene is upon the account of some over-free discourses of his at the Palace Royal, ordered by His Majesty to retire from the Court, and to continue at Rochefort till his pleasure be farther known.

Letters of the 7th inflant from Venice, Inform us, that the French Voluntiers made a flour Selly the 19th paft out of the Fort Sabionera, and best the Turks above 50 paces from their Pofts, by which means the belieged have liberty on that fide to repair their Out-works.

The King having lately called a Council of Trade at the Louvre, it was there refolved that to thips fhould be fitted up with all poffible diligence, fix of them to be fent to Bengaia, and the other four to carry forces to St. Dominico, to augment the French Colony these.

Park, January 2. Monfieur Courtin lately prived here by poft from Lille to receive His Majefties laft refolution upon the account of the Negociation there, is again returned with equal fpeed, 'tis not believed that the Commiffioners are like to come to any agreement about the dependencies in dispute : the French Commiffioners having protefted His Majefties Right, and the refulal made by the others, to treat of any thing but about the limits.

From Heidleberg they write, that the Emperour has lent his Orders to the Prince Elector Palatine and Duke of Lorrain to dilarm within eight days after the receipt thereof, un

der pein of being declared against by the whole Empire; and the Circle of the Rhine is ordered upon their refu[a], to arm against them.

His most Christian Majesty has sent also to the Duke of Lorrain to lay down has arms, left he be otherwise obliged to reduce his forces to the number limited by the Ireaty of the Py zneans.

From Perpignan we are told, that the Duke d' Offona is preparing for the terorn to Madrid, and 'tis faid, the Mara quis d' Ayrona has 2 Commiffien from the Queen Regent to fuccred him in the Government of Catalonia.

Hague, Dec. 30. The Governour of Hulfs having informed the States; that on the 9th and 10th inflant, the Minifter of Kieldreff neerthat Garrifon, had been forbidden by a Spanish Officer to preach any more in that Temple, pretending it was built upon the Spanish Territories, and, threatning him with force if he persisted, but refusing to shew any Commillion for his acting, the States kave ordered the Governour to take care of that place, and to defend the Minister and People, in cafe any thing should be attempted on them.

The conference be: ween the States General and thole of Holland, and the Council of State, abcut the disbanding of the 27 Companies, is but little advanced by realon of the ablence of the Penfionary de Raedt, who is at prefent at Amfterdam; but in the mean time for the prevention of farther disputes of the like nature, the Council of State have fent out their Letters to feveral Governours of the Frontier Towns adviling them for the future, to be contious in giving obedience to the Orders which shall be fent from any particular Province.

From the Vly we are advided of the arrival of two thips from America, viz. the Sr. Fames and the Peace; as also of the Sr. Peter and St. Baldus in Zealand from Lilbao, and of leveral thips trom Malaga at the Texel; but this much feared left the Golden Mountain a confiderable thip, be milcarried, the company having not any news of her.

The States continue their refolutions to put to fea a confiderable Fleet this next Spring, and in order thereunto the leveral Admiralcies have order to fend their Deputies to the Hague by the 12th of *Eebruary*, to confult about their number and equipage; one Squadron tis believed may be defigned for the streights.

Plymouth, Dec. 22. Yefterday was forced in litther by fitrels of weather the *Morning Star* of *i ondon* bound for the *Eaft Indies*, having by the violence of the winds spent both her main and foremath, with which the intends in little time to be supplyed in this place.
