## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Representation of the People Acts, 1918 to 1921, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under those Acts:

And whereas by section 40 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that the Representation of the People Order should be amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by those Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice

of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The following forms shall be substituted for the forms under Heading I in Schedule II to the Representation of the People Order:—
- I. FORMS OF INFORMATION TO BE RE-QUIRED FROM HOUSEHOLDERS, OCCUPIERS, ETC.

FORM A (HOUSEHOLDER).

1. Men and Women of 21 years of age and over, excluding Female Domestic Servants in house inhabited by Occupier.

2. Soldiers and Sailors and other persons of 19 years of age and over who would be living here but for absence in Army or Navy or other war service abroad or afloat (including Merchant Seamen).

3. Discharged Soldiers and Sailors of 19

years of age and over.
