MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE AND FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE Workers Effective as from 4th November, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case not later than 10th November, 1921.
