towards the endowment of the District herein

proposed to be constituted:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have signified by a Writing bearing date the 20th day of October, 1921, under our Common Seal, our approval of and consent to the proposed endowment of the said

proposed District:

And whereas the said endowment of Three hundred pounds per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Heeley and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named The District of Saint Aidan, Sheffield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the Town and Parish of Sheffield and their successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aidan, Sheffield,

comprising: -"I. All that portion of the New Parish (scmetime Particular District) of Saint John the Fvangelist, Sheffield Park, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the New Parish of Darnall, upon the south-east partly by the Parish of Handsworth and partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless, upon the south-west partly by the New Parish (sometime District) of Heeley and partly by the New Parish of Dyer's Hill, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining

side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, at the junction of City Road with Fitzwalter Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Fitzwalter Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $36\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from White's Lane and Manor Laiths Gardens to Manor Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 800 upon the Ordnance Maps of the City of Sheffield published in the years 1905 and 1906 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map or Plan which is annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence north-eastward first to and then along the said fence and along the fence forming the northwestern boundary of the close numbered 801 upon the said Maps for a distance in all of 123 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence crosses the middle of the footpath leading from White's Lane to Manor Lane and Corker Bottoms Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manor Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Manor Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Corker Bottoms Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Corker Bottoms Lane for a distance of $31\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Corker Bottoms Lane across the stream known as Kirk Bridge Dike, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 241 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, the New Parish of Attercliffe, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New

Parish of Darnall all meet.
"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Heeley, which is bounded upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless, upon the north-east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, upon the north by the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill, and upon the remaining part, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill from the said New Parish of Heeley at a point in the middle of Granville Road near the northern entrance to Norfolk Park and opposite to the middle of the footpath running along the eastern side of the said park to Arbourthorne Road, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets Arbourthorne Road, and extending thence south-eastward across Arbourthorne Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Arbourthorne Road past the western end of Spring Lane to Hagg Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of
