

(2) The modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Undertakers by substituting for the standard prices per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised, with an addition to meet increases in the costs and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by the Undertakers since 30th June, 1914, standard prices per therm (*i.e.*, 100,000 British Thermal Units).

The standard prices now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Undertakers are as follows:—

(a) Within the limits of supply as defined by the Tonbridge Gas Act, 1872, three shillings and ninepence per 1,000 cubic feet.

(b) Beyond those limits four shillings and sixpence.

The prices which the Undertakers have asked the Board of Trade to substitute for these prices in accordance with paragraph (2) above are as follows:—

(a) Within the limits as defined by the Tonbridge Gas Act, 1872, 16·3 pence per therm.

(b) Beyond those limits 18 pence per therm.

GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920.

Notice of Application by the Barnet District Gas and Water Company for an Order under Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Barnet District Gas and Water Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") have applied to the Board of Trade under the provisions of Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for an Order providing for—

(a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Undertakers to supply gas of any particular calorific value and the substitution thereof of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; and

(b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Undertakers by substituting for the maximum prices per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised with an addition to meet increases in the costs and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by the Undertakers since 30th June, 1914, maximum prices per therm (*i.e.*, 100,000 British Thermal Units).

The maximum prices per therm proposed by the Undertakers in substitution for the present maximum prices of four shillings and sixpence, four shillings and threepence and four shillings per 1,000 cubic feet under Section 42, Barnet District Gas and Water Act, 1872, are eighteen and two-fifths pence, seventeen and four-fifths pence, and seventeen and one-fifth pence per therm, and it is proposed that under this Section three-fifths of a penny per therm shall be substituted for threepence per 1,000 cubic feet, and in substitution for the present maximum price of six shillings under Section 43, Barnet District Gas and Water Act, 1872, twenty-two pence per therm, and in substitution for the present maximum price of four shillings and sixpence under Section 72 of the Barnet District Gas and Water Act, 1883, eighteen and two-fifths pence per therm, and it is proposed that under Section 72 of the Barnet District Gas and Water Act, 1883, forty-nine shillings per ton shall be substituted for sixteen shillings and threepence per ton and that three-fifths of a penny per therm shall be substituted for threepence per thousand cubic feet.
