The following Statute made by the Govern-
ing Body of Pembroke College, Cambridge,
on the 10th day of October, 1921, has been
submitted for the approval of His Majesty in
Council, and notice of its having been so sub-
mitted is published in accordance with the pro-
visions of the Universities of Oxford and Cam-
bridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of
the College of Valence Mary, commonly
called Pembroke College, in the University
of Cambridge, which amending Statute was
duly made at a meeting of the Governing
Body of the College specially summoned
for this purpose and held on the 10th day
of October, 1921, and having been passed
at such meeting by the votes of more than
two-thirds of the number of persons present
and voting is now submitted for the approval
of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master or Keeper and Fellows and
Scholars of the said College in exercise of the
powers given to us by the 54th Section of the
Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act,
1877, do hereby alter and amend the existing
Statutes of our said College in manner follow-
ing:—

By repealing in Chapter III. intituled "Of
the Fellows," Section 21, and substituting
therefor the following Section to form an
Amended Section 21:—

21. Notwithstanding any of the fore-
going provisions, a Fellow holding any of
the College offices next hereinafter men-
tioned shall be entitled to retain his Fellow-
ship so long as he shall continue to hold any
of those offices, and for that purpose the
continuity shall not be deemed to be broken
by mere transference from one of those
offices to another. The offices lastly herein-
before referred to (which are hereinafter
designated privileged College offices) are
those of Principal Tutor, Dean and Treas-
urer, and also such other College offices
(including at least two lectureships) as a
majority of all the members for the time
being of the Society may at a General
College Meeting, if they deem it expedient,
pronounce privileged (during the tenure of
the Member of the Society then holding
such office) for any period not exceeding
five years, provided that the number of
members of the Society holding privileged
offices at one time shall not exceed six.

In any exceptional case in which the
operation of the foregoing Section would
entail special hardship on any Member of
the Society the Society is empowered, with
the consent of the Visitor, to increase tem-
porarily the number of privileged offices.

PROCEDURE.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with
Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act,
1893, that the Rule Committee of the Supreme
Court propose to make the following Rules:—

ORDER XXXVII.

1. Rule 41 of Order XXXVII is hereby
annulled, and the following Rule shall stand in
lieu thereof, viz.:—

"41. The examinations to be taken before
the examiners of the court shall be distri-
buted among them in rotation by such clerk
in the office of the registrars of the Chancery
Division as the chief registrar may from time
to time determine."

ORDER LI.

2. Rule 9 of Order LI is hereby annulled,
and the following Rule shall stand in lieu
thereof, viz.:—

"9. The business to be referred to the
conveyancing counsel of the court shall be
distributed among them in rotation by such
clerk in the office of the registrars of the
Chancery Division as the chief registrar may
from time to time determine."

ORDER LVIII.

3. The following Rule shall be inserted in
Order LVIII after Rule 9:—

"9A. Appeals from orders in bankruptcy
matters made by a County Court shall be
heard by a Divisional Court of that Division
of the High Court of which the Judge to
whom bankruptcy business is for the time
being assigned is a member."

4. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of
the Supreme Court (No. 3), 1921.

Committee of the Supreme Court have certified
that on account of urgency the said Rules
should come into operation on the 21st Novem-
ber, 1921, as Provisional Rules, in accordance
with Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act,
1893.
