The following Statute, made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 19th day of October, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows especially summoned for this purpose on the 19th day of October, 1921, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

CHAPEL SERVICES.

- 1. In clause 1 of Statute XI. of the Statutes of 1881 under the title "Chapel Services" the words "four Chaplains" shall be struck out and the words "two Chaplains" shall be substituted.
- 2. In clause 3 of the same Statute the words and figures "£200 per annum; the stipend of each of the other Chaplains" shall be struck

out and the following words and figures shall be substituted: "£150 per annum; the stipend of the other Chaplain."

3. In clause 8 of the same Statute the figures "2500" shall be struck out and the figures "2750" shall be substituted.
