WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council (in the Act referred to as Irish Transfer Orders) make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provisions of the said Act:

And whereas by Section 38 of the said Act it is declared that the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in Ireland the following Courts, that is to say, a Court having jurisdiction in Southern Ireland to be called the Supreme Court of Judicature in Southern Ireland, a Court having jurisdiction in Northern Ireland, to be called the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland, and a Court having appellate jurisdiction throughout the

whole of Ireland, to be called the High Court of Appeal for Ireland:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and shall have effect subject to any subsequent Order in Council under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

(2) In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) "The Act" means the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

(b) "The appointed day" means the day appointed under Section 73 of the Act for the establishment in Ireland of the Courts authorized by Section 38 of the Act.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(4) The General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, shall apply to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland as from the appointed day.

2.—(1) References in any enactment to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland, and to any Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office of that Supreme Court shall from and after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland in the manner provided by Section 38 of the Act be construed respectively as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and to the Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office thereof exercising corresponding jurisdiction or powers in Northern Ireland. Provided that in Section 4 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, and in the Schedule to the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1919, references to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland shall be construed as references to the Lord Lieutenant acting after consultation with the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland and the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

(2) References in any enactment to the Attorney-General for Ireland shall from and after such establishment be construed as references to the Attorney-General for Northern Ireland except that the Lord Lieutenant may, if he thinks fit, appoint some other person to act instead of the Attorney-General for Northern Ireland in relation to any matters which are not for the time being within the powers of the Government of Northern Ireland and in that case the references shall in relation to those matters be construed as references to the person so appointed.

(3) References in any enactment to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland intrusted for the time being by virtue of the Royal Sign Manual with special jurisdiction in lunacy shall, from and after such establishment, be construed as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland for the time being intrusted in the like manner with the like jurisdiction in lunacy in Northern Ireland; and references in any enactment to the Lunacy Office, to the Registrar in Lunacy and to other Officers of, or attached to, that Office shall, from and after such establishment, be construed respectively as references to the Lunacy Office in Northern Ireland, to the Registrar in Lunacy in Northern Ireland, and to the Officers of, or attached to, that office.

(4) Where a provision or expression occurring in any of the said enactments has been amended, altered or adapted by or in pursuance of any of the subsequent enactments this Order shall be read as referring to the provision or expression as so amended, altered or adapted.

3. The following provisions and adaptations shall after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland have effect in relation thereto:—

(1) The Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may, by writing under his hand, assign to any Officer of or attached to the said Court any jurisdiction, powers, duties or functions which immediately before the appointed day were exercised or performed by any Officer of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland; and by virtue of such assignment such first-mentioned Officer shall be deemed to be an Officer exercising jurisdiction or powers corresponding with those of such second-mentioned Officer, within the meaning of Article 5 (1) of the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921.

(2) The Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall assign to one of the Judges of the

High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland (hereinafter called "The Chancery Judge") all such business and matters as were by any of the Judicature (Ireland) Acts, 1877 to 1907, assigned to the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice in Ireland. Any references in any Act to the Land Judges of the Chancery Division shall be construed as references to the said Chancery Judge.

(3) Every Writ of Summons issued in Northern Ireland shall be tested in the name of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, or if the office of Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland be vacant, in the name of the Senior Lord Justice of Appeal in Northern Ireland for the time being.

(4) The forms contained in the Appendices to the Rules of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland dated the 22nd day of February, 1905, shall be used in the cases in which they are applicable, with such modification as may be necessary by reason of the provisions of the Act and of this Order.

(5) The Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, shall be read with the following adaptations and modifications:—

(a) In Section 33 the words directing the Judge to have regard to the comparative cost and convenience of proceedings in Ireland shall be read distributively with reference to Southern and Northern Ireland respectively;

(b) Section 43 shall be construed as applying to all the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland;

(c) Section 56 shall be read as if the following words were substituted for the first sentence therein:—

Every appeal to the Court of Appeal in Northern Ireland may, whether the subject matter of the appeal is a final or an interlocutory order, decree or judgment, be heard before not less than two judges of the said Court sitting together.

4. In giving effect to Section 61 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, as amended by Section 12 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, the following adaptations shall be made:—

The persons upon whose recommendation the Lord Lieutenant may make, alter, or annul rules, under the first-mentioned section, shall be a majority of all the judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland for the time being (of which the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall be one), and shall include one Barrister and one Solicitor (respectively practising in Northern Ireland), to be appointed for the purpose by the said Lord Chief Justice, by writing under his hand, for such time as may be specified by him.

5. Section 11 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, shall be adapted to read as follows:—The powers, functions, matters and things mentioned in Section 4 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1887, may be exercised and done by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, subject to the conditions referred to in the said Section.

6. In the application of Section 73 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, to the first appointments of Officers of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland or Officers of the High Court of Jus-

tice in Northern Ireland or attached to the said Court or to any Division thereof the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a) All such Officers shall be appointed by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

(b) The direction contained in the said Section as to appointment by competition in the case of junior clerkships shall not apply to any appointments made within a period of two months from the appointed day.

7. References in Sections 4, 5 and 6 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, to "one of the Judges of the Queen's Bench Division to be assigned by the Lord Lieutenant" shall respectively be construed as references to one of the Judges of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland to be assigned by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

8. References (as to appeals) in Sections 132-133 of the Civil Bill Courts (Ireland) Act, 1851, in Section 7 of the County Courts Amendment (Ireland) Act, 1882, and in Section 11 of the County Court Appeals (Ireland) Act, 1889, shall have effect in Northern Ireland as if in the said sections there were substituted for the words "Recorder of Dublin" or "Chairman of the County of Dublin" the words "Recorder of Belfast and County Court Judge of Antrim" and for the words "County or County of the City of Dublin" the words "City of Belfast" and "County of Antrim."

9. Sections 35, 36, and 37 of the Civil Bill Courts Procedure Amendment Act (Ireland), 1864, shall have effect in Northern Ireland as if for the several references therein to the Superior Courts of Common Law there were substituted references to the Court of Appeal for Northern Ireland.

10. References in any existing Act, Rule, or Order to the "Four Courts, Dublin" in relation to any matter of judicature shall be construed as references to the County Courthouse, Belfast, or to such other Courthouse as may from time to time be appointed or used for the sittings of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland.

11. References to publication in the Dublin Gazette shall be construed as references to publication in the Belfast Gazette.

12. Section 22 of the Juries (Ireland) Act, 1871, as to the service of jury-summonses by post, shall apply as if for the references therein to the county of the city of Dublin there were substituted references to the county of the city of Belfast.

13. In any existing Acts, Order, or Rule, relating to the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland in Probate or Matrimonial causes or matters, references to "the principal registry" or to the Registrar or Registrars thereof shall respectively be construed as references to the Registry in Belfast, attached to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland, and to such Officer or Officers thereof as the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may assign.

14. References in Section 27 of the Parliamentary Elections Act, 1868, to "the prescribed Officer" shall be construed as references to such Officer of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland as the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may assign.

(b) "Existing" means as regards Judges, Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland who on the appointed day had not resigned or retired from office or who had not been transferred to Northern Ireland under Part III of the Seventh Schedule to the Act.

(c) "The appointed day" means the day appointed under Section 73 of the Act for the establishment in Ireland of the Courts authorized by Section 38 of the Act.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(4) The General Adaptation of Enactments (Southern Ireland) Order, 1921, shall apply to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Southern Ireland as from the appointed day.

2.—(1) His Majesty's Court of Appeal in Southern Ireland shall be constituted as follows:—The Judges thereof shall be The Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, who shall be President thereof, The Master of the Rolls so long as he retains his present office, and the two existing Lords Justices of the Court of Appeal.

(2) The Lord Chief Justice of Ireland may request any Judge of the High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland to attend at any time for the purpose of sitting as an additional

Judge of the Court of Appeal in Southern Ireland, and any Judge whose attendance is so requested, shall attend accordingly and while attending shall be deemed to be an additional Judge of that Court of Appeal.

(3) The Court of Appeal in Southern Ireland may sit in two Divisions.

3.—(1) His Majesty's High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland shall be constituted as follows:—The Judges thereof shall be The Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, who shall be President thereof, The Master of the Rolls, and the existing Judges of the High Court of Justice in Ireland.

(2) The Judicial Commissioner of the Land Commission shall by virtue of his office be an additional Judge of the High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland for the purpose of his powers and duties in relation to land purchase and the existing Judicial Commissioner shall also be an additional Judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Southern Ireland with the rights and subject to the duties referred to in Section 41 of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1881.

4. There shall be in His Majesty's High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland instead of the five Divisions mentioned in Section 34 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, two Divisions consisting of the Judges following, that is to say:—

(a) One Division, to be named the Chancery Division, shall consist of the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, who shall be President thereof, the Master of the Rolls, and one other Judge, and after the next vacancy in the office of the Master of the Rolls, two Judges.

(b) One other Division, to be named the King's Bench Division, shall consist of the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, who shall be President thereof, and four Judges.

The existing Judicial Commissioner of the Land Commission may act as an additional Judge in either Division.

5.—(1) References in any enactment to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland, and to any Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office of that Supreme Court shall, from and after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland in the manner provided by Section 38 of the Act be construed respectively as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland, and to the Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office thereof exercising corresponding jurisdiction or powers in Southern Ireland.

Provided that in Section 4 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, and in the Schedule to the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1919, references to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland shall be construed as references to the Lord Lieutenant acting after consultation with the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland and the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

(2) References in any enactment to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland intrusted for the time being by virtue of the Royal Sign Manual with special jurisdiction in lunacy shall, from and after such establishment, be construed as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland for the time being intrusted in the like manner with the like jurisdiction in lunacy in Southern Ireland; and references in any enactment to the

Lunacy Office, the Registrar in Lunacy and other officers of, or attached to, that office shall, from and after such establishment, be construed respectively as references to the Lunacy Office in Southern Ireland, to the Registrar in Lunacy in Southern Ireland, and to the officers of, or attached to, that office.

(3) References in any enactment to the Attorney-General for Ireland shall from and after such establishment be construed as references to the Attorney-General for Southern Ireland or such other Officer as may be designated by the Lord Lieutenant.

(4) Where a provision or expression occurring in any of the said enactments has been amended, altered, or adapted by or in pursuance of any of the subsequent enactments, this Order shall be read as referring to the provision or expression as so amended, altered or adapted.

6. The following provisions and adaptations shall after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland have effect in relation thereto:—

(1) Every Writ of Summons and every other Writ in Southern Ireland shall be tested in the name of the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, and if the Office of Lord Chief Justice of Southern Ireland shall be vacant, in the name of the Senior Lord Justice of His Majesty's Court of Appeal in Southern Ireland for the time being.

(2) The forms contained in the Appendices to the Rules of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland, dated the 22nd day of February, 1905, shall be used in the cases to which they are applicable with such modifications as may be necessary by reason of the provisions of the Act and of this Order.

(d) The provisions in Section 73 as to the appointment of Junior Clerks shall not apply until Regulations shall have been made by the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland for the qualification of candidates and the subjects of examination, and the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland may with the concurrence of the Treasury make such appointments to all such offices as in the meantime may be deemed necessary;

(e) Any statutable power existing under or by virtue of any Act to enable any Judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland to appoint to any office or to employ any person in duties appertaining to any office in the Supreme Court of Judicature in Southern Ireland shall cease and the right of appointing to all such offices and dismissal

therefrom shall rest in and be exercised by the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland:

Provided however that this clause shall not apply to any office or position attached to the person of a Judge including Circuit Registrars, Tipstaves and Criers and provided also that this clause shall not apply to a Judge transferred to the Supreme Court of Southern Ireland under the provisions of the Act in respect of any patronage which continues vested in him unless he so consents.

7. Section 11 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (No. 2) Act, 1897, shall be adapted to read as follows:—"The powers, functions, matters and things mentioned in Section 4 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1887, may be exercised and done by the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland subject to the conditions referred to in the said Section."

8. References in Sections 4, 5 and 6 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, to "one of the Judges of the Queen's Bench Division to be assigned by the Lord Lieutenant" shall respectively be construed as references to one of the Judges of the High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland to be assigned by the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland and Clause 6 (3) (e) of this Order shall have effect in reference to the appointment and dismissal of any of the officers attached to any of the Courts mentioned in these Sections.

9. The Lord Chief Justice of Ireland shall assign to one of the Judges of the High Court of Justice in Southern Ireland the duties heretofore performed by the Land Judge of the Chancery Division, and the Judge so assigned shall have all the power, jurisdiction and authority of the Land Judge.

10. Sections 35, 36 and 37 of the Civil Bill Courts Procedure Amendment Act (Ireland), 1864, shall have effect as if for the several references therein to the superior Courts of Common Law were substituted references to His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Southern Ireland.

11.—(1) All securities and money (including any interest or dividends not theretofore received) which on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, were vested in the Accountant-General of the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland as such, and all books and property appertaining to the office of the said Accountant-General shall be, and shall from the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, be deemed to have been transferred to, and vested in, the Accountant-General of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland without the necessity of any transfer, assignment, or other instrument.

(2) In this article the expression "securities" includes Government securities and any security of any British possession, foreign state, or any body corporate or company or standing in books kept by any body corporate, company, or person, and all stock funds and effects.

12.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in any other provision of this Order, the powers conferred on the Lord Chancellor by Section 84 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, to fix and alter fees and percentages with the advice and consent of the presidents of the divisions of the High Court or any one of them and with the concurrence of the Treasury shall, so far as respects fees and per-

centages to be taken in connection with any matter the execution whereof is under or in pursuance of the Act transferred from the Lord Chancellor to the Lord Lieutenant, be exercised by the Lord Lieutenant with the concurrence of the Treasury of the United Kingdom, but without the necessity of obtaining the advice or consent of any of the Judges of any Supreme Court.

(2) Subject to the exercise by the Lord Lieutenant of the powers aforesaid, the fees and percentages authorized to be taken in connection with any of the matters aforesaid by any Order made under the said Section and in force immediately before the said transfer shall continue to be taken.

13. Upon the death or resignation of the existing Lord Chief Justice of Ireland the powers and duties vested in him shall devolve upon and be exercised and performed by his successor in the Office of Lord Chief Justice of Southern Ireland, and references in this Order to the Lord Chief Justice of Ireland shall be construed accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921.

(2) In this Order unless the context otherwise requires:

The expression "the Act" means the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

The expression "day of transfer" means in relation to any Irish service, the day appointed for the transfer of that service as respects Northern Ireland from the Government of the United Kingdom.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The enactments relating to or affecting Irish services shall in their application to Northern Ireland, have effect in relation to anything done on or after the day of transfer or to be done on or after that day with the modification and adaptations set out in this Order, save where inconsistent with the Act or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under the Act and subject as respects

matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland to repeal or alteration by that Parliament.

(2) Save as otherwise expressly provided in this Order, the said modifications and adaptations shall apply only as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

3. References to Parliament and to each, either, or both of the Houses of Parliament shall, from and after the day of transfer, be construed respectively as references to the Parliament of Northern Ireland, and to each, either, or both of the Houses of that Parliament and the expression "Parliamentary" shall be construed accordingly:

Provided that references to matters or things authorized or constituted by Act of Parliament shall be construed as references to matters or things authorized or constituted by Act either of the Parliament of the United Kingdom or of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

4.—(1) References to any department or authority of the United Kingdom Government, if they occur in relation to functions which under or in pursuance of the Act are transferred as respects Northern Ireland to any department, branch of a department, or authority of the Government of Northern Ireland shall from and after the day of transfer be construed as references to the department, branch or authority to which they are transferred; and references to the Chief Secretary if they occur in relation to any such functions shall be construed as references to the appropriate Minister of Northern Ireland.

(2) Provisions with respect to the Under Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant shall cease to have effect after the day of transfer.

5. References to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland, and to any Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office of that Supreme Court shall from and after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland (whether before or after the day of transfer) be construed respectively as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland and to the Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office thereof exercising corresponding jurisdiction or powers in Northern Ireland.

6.—(1) References to the Consolidated Fund, to the Exchequer and to the Comptroller and Auditor-General shall from and after the day of transfer be construed respectively as references to the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland to the Exchequer of Northern Ireland and to the Comptroller and Auditor-General of Northern Ireland.

(2) Provisions with respect to the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account, the Guarantee Fund or the Ireland Development Grant shall cease to have effect after the day of transfer.

7. From and after the day of transfer:—

(a) References to the Dublin Gazette shall be construed as references to the Belfast Gazette;

(b) References to Dublin where they occur in relation to Superior Courts or in relation to Officers or Offices whose functions are as respects Northern Ireland transferred to the Government of Northern Ireland shall be construed as references to Belfast;

(c) References to Ireland where they occur in relation to Counties or other areas of local jurisdiction or government in Ireland, shall be construed as references to Northern Ireland.

8. Where a provision or expression occurring in any of the said enactments has been amended, altered or adapted by or in pursuance of any of the subsequent enactments this Order shall be read as referring to the provision or expression as so amended, altered or adapted.

9. The adaptations and modifications set out in the foregoing articles of this Order shall apply to any order scheme rule or regulation made under any of the said enactments and in force in Northern Ireland immediately before the day of transfer in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made and any such order scheme rule or regulation shall continue in force in Northern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made under the said enactment as so modified and adapted.

10. There shall be made in every local and personal Act such adaptations and modifications as may be required to bring it into conformity with the provisions of this Order.

WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provisions of the Act:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the General Adaptation of Enactments (Southern Ireland) Order, 1921.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

The expression "the Act" means the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

The expression "day of transfer" means, in relation to any Irish service, the day appointed for the transfer of that service as respects Southern Ireland from the Government of the United Kingdom.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The enactments relating to or affecting Irish services shall, in their application to Southern Ireland, have effect in relation to anything done on or after the day of transfer or to be done on or after that day, with the modifi-

cations and adaptations set out in this Order, save where inconsistent with the Act or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under the Act, and subject, as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Southern Ireland, to repeal or alteration by that Parliament.

(2) Save as otherwise expressly provided in this Order, the said modifications and adaptations shall apply only as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Southern Ireland.

3. References to Parliament and to each, either, or both of the Houses of Parliament shall, from and after the day of transfer, be construed respectively as references to the Parliament of Southern Ireland, and to each, either, or both of the Houses of that Parliament; and the expression "Parliamentary" shall be construed accordingly:

Provided that references to matters or things authorized or constituted by Act of Parliament shall be construed as references to matters or things authorized or constituted by Act either of the Parliament of the United Kingdom or of the Parliament of Southern Ireland.

4.—(1) References to any department or authority of the United Kingdom Government, if they occur in relation to functions which under or in pursuance of the Act are transferred as respects Southern Ireland to any department, branch of a department, or authority of the Government of Southern Ireland, shall, from and after the day of transfer, be construed as references to the department, branch, or authority to which they are transferred; and references to the Chief Secretary, if they occur in relation to any such functions, shall be construed as references to the appropriate Minister of Southern Ireland.

(2) Provisions with respect to the Under-Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant shall cease to have effect after the day of transfer.

5.—(1) References to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland, and to any Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office of that Supreme Court shall, from and after the establishment of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland (whether before or after the day of transfer) be construed respectively as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Southern Ireland, to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland, and to the Division, Court, Judge, Officer or Office thereof exercising corresponding jurisdiction or powers in Southern Ireland.

(2) References to the Attorney-General shall, from and after such establishment, be construed as references to the Attorney-General for Southern Ireland or such other Officer as may be designated by the Lord Lieutenant.

6.—(1) References to the Consolidated Fund, to the Exchequer, and to the Comptroller and Auditor-General shall, from and after the day of transfer, be construed respectively as references to the Consolidated Fund of Southern Ireland, to the Exchequer of Southern Ireland, and to the Comptroller and Auditor-General of Southern Ireland.

(2) Provisions with respect to the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account, the Guarantee Fund or the Ireland Development Grant shall cease to have effect after the day of transfer.

7. From and after the day of transfer references to Ireland, where they occur in relation to counties or other areas of local jurisdiction or

government in Ireland, shall be construed as references to Southern Ireland.

8. Where a provision or expression occurring in any of the said enactments has been amended, altered, or adapted by or in pursuance of any of the subsequent enactments, this Order shall be read as referring to the provision or expression as so amended, altered or adapted.

9. The adaptations and modifications set out in the foregoing articles of this Order shall apply to any order, scheme, rule or regulation made under any of the said enactments and in force in Southern Ireland immediately before the day of transfer in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made and any such order, scheme, rule or regulation shall continue in force in Southern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made under the said enactment as so modified and adapted.

10. There shall be made in every local and personal Act such adaptations and modifications as may be required to bring it into conformity with the provisions of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1922, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, shall have effect as amended by this Order.

V, c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914":

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 27th day of May, 1921, until the 1st day of January, 1922:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision, and of all other powers Him

thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of July, 1922.

WHEREAS by Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29), as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914 (4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18), and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80), it is enacted as follows:—

"91. (1) If His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government of any Foreign State for mutual protection of inventions, or designs, or trade marks, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade mark in that State, or his legal representative or assignee, shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905, in priority to other applicants; and the patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in the Foreign State.

"Provided that—

"(a) The application is made in the case of a patent within 12 months, and in the case of a design or trade mark within 4 months, from the application for protection in the Foreign State; and

"(b) Nothing in this Section shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the actual date on which his complete specification is accepted, or his design or trade mark is registered, in this country.

"(2) The patent granted for the invention or the registration of a design or trade mark shall not be invalidated:—

"(a) In the case of a patent, by reason only of the publication of a description of, or use of, the invention; or

"(b) In the case of a design, by reason only of the exhibition or use of, or the publication of a description or representation of, the design; or

"(c) In the case of a trade mark, by reason only of the use of the trade mark; in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the period specified in this Section as that within which the application may be made.

"(3) The application for the grant of a patent, or the registration of a design, or the registration of a trade mark under this Section, must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905:—

"Provided that—

"(a) In the case of patents the application shall be accompanied by a complete specification, which, if it is not accepted within the 12 months from the application for protection in the Foreign State, shall

with the drawings (if any) be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period; and

“(b) In the case of trade marks, any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under the Trade Marks Act, 1905.

“(4) The provisions of this Section shall apply only in the case of those Foreign States with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable, and so long only in the case of each State as the Order in Council continues in force with respect to that State.

“(5) Where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the Legislature of any British Possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs, or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of this Section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order”:

And whereas by Section 103 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by Section 6 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, and by Section 1 of the Patents Act, 1901, and since repealed by Section 98 of the said Patents and Designs Act, 1907, provisions were made to the same or like effect as those above set forth as contained in Section 91 of the last-mentioned Act, and by the said Section 98 it was provided that “this repeal shall not affect any Convention, Order in Council, Rule, or Table of Fees having effect under any enactment so repealed, but any such Convention, Order in Council, Rules, or Table of Fees in force at the commencement of this Act shall continue in force, and may be repealed, altered or amended, as if it had been made under this Act”:

And whereas it pleased Her late Majesty Queen Victoria to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 103, and in virtue of a Declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, on the 17th March, 1884, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain and Ireland to the International Convention and Protocol for the protection of Industrial Property, signed by Representatives of certain Powers on the 20th March, 1883, and duly ratified on the 6th June, 1884, power being reserved to Her Majesty to accede thereafter to the provisions of the said Convention and Protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's Possessions, which Declaration of Accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the Signatory Powers by and in virtue of a Declaration dated the 2nd April, 1884:

And whereas on the 14th December, 1900, at Brussels, an Additional Act was agreed upon between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Heads of the Foreign Countries parties thereto for the purpose of modifying certain of the provisions of the said International Convention and the Protocol annexed thereto, the ratification of which Additional Act was duly effected:

And whereas by a Convention signed at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, His Majesty and the Heads of the Foreign States

named therein agreed to make certain modifications in and additions to the said Convention dated 20th March, 1883, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other States:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty King Edward VII and His present Majesty have been pleased to declare that the hereinbefore mentioned provisions of the said Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (as amended), should apply to the several Foreign Countries named in the said Orders parties to the said Convention and Protocols:

And whereas the Free City of Danzig has acceded to the said International Convention, Protocol and Additional Act as revised at Washington on 2nd June, 1911:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers in Him vested by the above-recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914, and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, shall apply to the Free City of Danzig.

2. This Order shall take effect from the 21st November, 1921.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom herein-after mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of October, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Biddulph, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Biddulph is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Biddulph which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed separate District, Robert Heath, of Biddulph Grange, Biddulph, Esquire, has contributed a sum of £5,000 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) and has transferred the same into our name to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act:

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock and to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of £200:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £1,000 in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of £50:

"And whereas the said grant of £1,000 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said sum of £5,000 £4 per centum Funding Stock has been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Robert Heath, as a contributor of the said sum of Stock has nominated as the persons to whom he desires that the Patronage of the said proposed District, or New Parish should be assigned, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Biddulph for the first turn of presentation, and John Henry Buxton, of Easeneye, Ware, in the County of Hertford, Esquire, Sir Edward Hildred Carlile, of Ponsbourne Park, in the said County of Hertford, Baronet, the Reverend Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, of Number 1, Evelyn Gardens, London, S.W., Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, the Venerable Robert Charles Joynt, of Holy Trinity Vicarage, Redhill, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames, and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of the Rectory, Birmingham, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, the Reverend Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, of the College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Durham, and Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, of Number 3, Hare Court, Temple, in the City of London, one of Your Majesty's Counsel and a Member of the Commons House of Parliament (commonly known as the Patronage Trustees of the Church Pastoral Aid Society) for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation:

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Biddulph which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid

become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Knypersley.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Biddulph for the first turn of presentation and the said John Henry Buxton, Edward Hildred Carlile, Hamner William Webb-Peploe, Robert Charles Joynt, Edward Gross Hodge, Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, and Thomas Walter Hobart Inskip, their heirs and assigns, for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint John, Knypersley, being:—

"And whereas the said Benefice of Uttoxeter is now full, the Reverend Leslie Knights Smith being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Bramshall is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Leslie Knights Smith has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union of benefices which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Bramshall and Uttoxeter based upon the terms recommended in the hereinbefore mentioned Report to the Bishop of Lichfield, and further for effecting such transfer or alteration in the exercise of Patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and

propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Bramshall and the said Benefice of Uttoxeter shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Uttoxeter with Bramshall' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Leslie Knights Smith if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Uttoxeter shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That a Curate be employed to assist in performing the duties of the United Benefice.

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby

to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for exceptional purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II. (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the

animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

3.—(1) The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days, and during such period no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be moved out of the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station defined in this Order until the expiration of the prescribed period of detention and until the animals, after such expiration, have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and declared by him to be free from disease and from the conditions imposed by the said Order of 1896 and this Order.

This condition is substituted for the fifth condition in Article 3 of the said Order of 1896 in respect of the said animals.
