WHEREAS by the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) (No. 2) Order, 1920, provision was made with respect to the currency of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates:

And whereas by the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920, certain of the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate were annexed to His Majesty's Dominions and are now known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas by virtue of the Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920, such of the territories of the East Africa Protectorate as are not included in the Colony are now known as the Protectorate of Kenya:

And whereas it was provided by each of the two last-mentioned Orders that nothing in the

Order should affect the validity of any Order in Council affecting the territories as respects which provision was made by the Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision with respect to the currency of the Colony and of the Protectorates:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance so far as relates to the Colony of the powers vested in Him by the British Settlements Act, 1887, and so far as relates to the Protectorates of the powers vested in Him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, and as respects both the Colony and the Protectorates of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) There shall be coined under the direction of the Master of the Mint for use in the Colony and the Protectorates a British East Africa shilling which shall be of the approved weight and composition, and shall be subject to remedies, or variations from the approved weight and composition, of such amount as may be approved.

(2) The British East Africa shilling shall be of the approved design and have the approved impressions.

2.—(1) The British East Africa shilling

shall be the standard coin of the Colony and the Protectorates.

(2) Every contract, sale, payment, bill, note, instrument, and security for money, and every transaction, dealing, matter and thing whatsoever relating to money or involving the payment of, or the liability to pay, any money, shall, in the absence of express agreement to the contrary, be deemed to be made, executed, entered into, done, and had in the Colony and the Protectorates according to the standard coin.

3.—(1) There may from time to time be coined under the Direction of the Master of the Mint for use in the Colony and the Protectorates subsidiary coins which shall be of such denominations, composition, and weights as may be approved and shall be subject to a remedy of such amount as may be approved.

(2) The subsidiary coins so coined shall as respects each coin bear an indication of the value of the coin in cents or hundredths of a shilling, and shall otherwise be of the approved design and have the approved impressions.

4.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, a tender of payment of money in the Colony and the Protectorates, if made in any of the coins issued under this Order, shall, if the coins have not been illegally dealt with, and, in the case of shillings have not become diminished in weight by wear or otherwise so as to be of less weight than the weight declared by Proclamation made by the Governor with the approval of the Master of the Mint and of a Secretary of State to be the least current weight, be a legal tender:—

(a) In the case of shillings, for the payment of any amount;

(b) In the case of fifty-cent pieces, for the payment of an amount not exceeding twenty shillings, but for no greater amount;

(c) In the case of coins of any lower denomination than fifty cents, for the payment of an amount not exceeding one shilling, but for no greater amount:

Provided that subsidiary coins issued under this Order shall not become legal tender, unless declared to be legal tender by a Proclamation made by the Governor and then only as from such date as is specified in the Proclamation.

(2) Each coin shall be a legal tender only for the amount of its denomination.

5.—(1) Where any sum due to be paid after the commencement of this Order is payable in pounds or pounds sterling, whether the obligation to make the payment was incurred before or after the commencement of this Order, the payment may be made in shillings at the rate of twenty shillings to the pound or pound sterling.

(2) Where any contract entered into or instrument made before the commencement of this Order provides for the making of any payment in terms of rupees or florins the contract or instrument shall have effect as if for references to any number of rupees or florins there were substituted references to twice that number of shillings.

(3) Where any contract entered into or instrument made before the commencement of this Order provides for the making of any payment in terms of cents, the contract or instrument shall have effect as if for references to any number of cents there were substituted references to twice that number of cents of a shilling.

6.—(1) For the purposes of this Order a coin

shall be deemed to have been illegally dealt with if the coin has been impaired, diminished, or lightened, otherwise than by fair wear and tear, or has been defaced by having any name, word, device or number stamped or engraved thereon, whether the coin has or has not been thereby diminished or lightened.

(2) Any coin which, by virtue of any Proclamation under this Order, has ceased to be legal tender or which has been illegally dealt with, or is below the least current weight, may be called in, out, broken, or defaced under the authority of the Governor, in accordance with such regulations as the Governor may make.

7.—(1) Every Proclamation made by the Governor under or in pursuance of this Order shall be made with the approval of the Treasury and a Secretary of State.

(2) Proclamations shall be made by the Governors respectively so that they shall so far as practicable take effect on the same day in the Colony and in each of the Protectorates.

8.—(1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

The expression "Uganda" means the Uganda Protectorate as defined in the Uganda Order in Council, 1902:

The expression "The Colony" means the Colony of Kenya:

The expression "The Protectorates" means the Kenya and Uganda Protectorates:

The expression "The Governor" means the Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, or the Governor of Uganda, as the case may be, and includes the person for the time being administering the Government:

The expression "approved" means approved by the Master of the Mint and a Secretary of State:

The expression "The Master of the Mint" means the Master of His Majesty's Royal Mint in England.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

9.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Kenya and Uganda (Currency) Order, 1921.

(2) This Order shall come into operation in the Colony and in each of the Protectorates respectively on such date as may be fixed by Proclamation by the Governor.

(3) Subject as hereinafter provided the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) (No. 2) Order, 1920, is hereby revoked as from the date of the commencement of this Order:

Provided that—

Notwithstanding the revocation of the said Order all coins and all currency notes which at the said date are legal tender thereunder shall, unless and until declared not to be legal tender by Proclamation made by the Governor, remain legal tender in accordance with the provisions of the said Order for the amount of their respective denominations at the rate of one rupee or one florin for two shillings, one fifty-cent piece for one shilling and two twenty-five cent pieces for one shilling, except that pieces of ten cents, five cents and one cent, shall for the purposes of tender of payment be taken to be pieces of ten cents, five cents and one cent respectively of a shilling instead of pieces of ten cents, five cents and one cent respectively of a florin.

1. The Proviso to paragraph (3) of Article 9 of the principal Order shall have effect as though for the words therein from "except that" to the end thereof there were substituted the words "and in the case of pieces of ten cents, five cents and one cent at the rate of one cent of a florin for two cents of a shilling."

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Kenya and Uganda (Currency) (No. 2) Order, 1921.

(2) This Order shall come into operation in the Colony and in each of the Protectorates respectively on the same date as the principal Order.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE WORKERS

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Sack and Bag Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order,

1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates, a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates for Female Workers, AND TO DECLARE the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

PART II

PROPOSED PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR ALL FEMALE WORKERS.

All Female Workers, 8d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the equivalent of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary Worker, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to Declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday) ...	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Trade Board propose to Fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work as follows:—

(A) For Workers employed on Time-Work:

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory

Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-section (A) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48:

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(B) For Workers employed on Piece-Work:

Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double Time, respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

The making from woven fabrics of corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags and similar sacks or bags, or the repairing thereof:

including:—

(a) the following and similar operations (whether performed by hand or machine) known in the trade as:—

(i) Folding (or hooking), cutting, machining, turning;

(ii) Brushing, selecting, mending;

(iii) Branding, tarring, bundling;

(b) the warehousing of, the packing of,

and similar operations in regard to sacks or bags of the kind mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing thereof;

(c) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (b) above;

but excluding:—

1. any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the weaving of jute, flax or hemp, or the dyeing, bleaching or finishing of jute, flax or hemp yarn or cloth;

2. any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in a business in which the sacks or bags are used as containers for other articles the production or sale of which forms part of the business;

3. the making of rope-bound coal or coke sacks when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in the making of made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned;

4. any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (b) above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned;

5. operations included in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

PART V.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 8th December, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Sack and Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

SORTING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST
OFFICE, LONDON.**

*These Regulations are liable to alteration for
future examinations.*

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of any ruminating animals or swine, the property of the Zoological Society of London, which are intended for exhibition in the Gardens of that Society, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II. (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of any such animals as may be landed in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined

by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to Animals on Landing.

4. Such animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days or such other period as may be specified in the licence authorising the landing of the animals. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

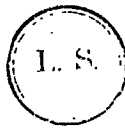

INFECTED PLACE.**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

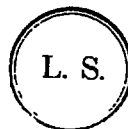
