

above Act for an Order or Orders modifying the provisions of Agreements dated 16th June, 1902, and 11th April, 1904, and made between the Paignton Urban District Council and the Brixham Urban District Council, and the provisions of agreements dated 5th July, 1904, 7th February, 1905, 3rd October, 1905, and 2nd December, 1909, and made between the Paignton Urban District Council and the Teignmouth Urban District Council, so as to enable the Paignton Urban District Council to make charges for water supplied in bulk to the Brixham Urban District Council and the Teignmouth Urban District Council at the prices of 10.6d. and 9.59d. per thousand gallons respectively.

CHICHESTER ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

1. The Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Chichester (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), whose address is at the Town Hall, Chichester, in the county of Sussex, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners, under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1919, for a Special Order for the following objects:—

(a) To revoke the Chichester Electric Lighting Order, 1898, and the Chichester Electric Lighting (Extension) Order, 1911, to annul the deed of transfer made under the first-mentioned Order between the Corporation of the one part and the Chichester Electric Light and Power Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") of the other part, and to empower the Company to sell and the Corporation to purchase the undertaking and works of the Company, and to sanction or confirm any agreement or agreements which may be entered into between the Corporation and the Company in that behalf.

(b) To authorize the Corporation to generate and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by

the above Acts within the city of Chichester, the parishes of Appledram, Birdham, Donnington, Earnley, East Wittering, Hunston, Lavant, Merston, New Fishbourne, North Mundham, Oving, Selsey, Sidlesham, Westhampnett, West Itchenor, and West Wittering, in the rural district of Westhampnett, and the parish of Bosham, in the rural district of Westbourne, all in the county of Sussex (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply"), and

(c) To authorize the Corporation to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

2. The names of the roads in which electric lines have been or are to be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—

In the city of Chichester.—Adelaide-road, Basin-road, Bognor-road, Broyle-road, Caledonian-road, Canon-lane, Cavendish-street, Cawley-road, Cleveland-road, Clydesdale-avenue, College-lane, Cross-street, East-street and Eastgate-square, East-walls, East-row, Franklin-place, George-street, Green-lane, Grove-road, Guildhall-street, High-street, Hornet, Lion-street, Little London, Lyndhurst-road, Market-road, New Park-road, North-street, Northgate, Orchard-street, Oving-road, the Pallants, Parchment-street, Priory-road, South-bank, South-street, Southgate, Spitalfields-lane, Stockbridge-road, St. James-road, St. John's-street, St. Martin's-street and Square, St. Pancras, St. Paul's-road, Terminus-road, Tower-street, Washington-street, West-street and Westgate, Whyke-lane, Whyke-road and York-road.

In the parish of New Fishbourne.—The Avenue, Highland-road, the portion of New-road between the Avenue and Highland-road, and the Broadway, all in the district of Summersdale.

In the parish of Donnington.—Between the city boundary and the junction of the road leading to Birdham and Donnington.

3. The roads not repairable by the local authority and the railways and tramways or light railways which the Corporation propose to take special powers by the Order to break up are as follows:—

(a) Streets—

In the city of Chichester.—Cathedral Close, Vicar's Close, Cathedral Churchyard, The Cloisters, Saint Richard's-walk, South-bank, Lake-road, Melbourne-road, roads on Joys Croft, Ettrick-road, Stirling-road, Pound Farm-road, Mount-lane, Infirmary-terrace, Spring-gardens, Friary-lane, Kingsham-road, Bigwood's-corner, Farr's-court, Champion's-court, Rose-court, Walker's-court, and the footway running from Kingsham-road to Basin-road.

In the parish of New Fishbourne.—The Broadway, The Avenue, The Drive, Highland-road, and New-road, all in the district of Summersdale.

In the parish of Selsey.—Albion-road, Bonnar-road, Beach-road, Beach-gardens, Clayton-road, Croft-road, Coastguard-lane, Crablands, Danefield-road, Fish-lane, Golf Links-lane, Grafton-road, Kingsway, Mill-lane, Manor-road, Marsh-road, Park-lane,
