PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

The Trade Board Propose to Vary the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade at present effective, and set out in Part II. of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 10th September, 1921, so that the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates shall be as follows:—

For the Periods during which the Cost of Living Index Figure is not less than 76 and not more than 113 ...

12½% above the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable.

For the Periods during which the Cost of Living Index Figure is not less than 63 and not more than 75 ...

15% above the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates proposed above in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th September, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the above-mentioned proposed Minimum Rates for Male Workers in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.
