Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915:  
Further extension of time for operation of a Confirming Act.

**BOROUGH OF ILKESTON.**

**W**HEREAS by Orders made by the Local Government Board under the provisions of Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1915"), and dated respectively the 20th day of May, 1918, and the 19th day of June, 1919, and by an Order made by the Minister of Health under the Act of 1915, and dated the 30th day of July, 1920, the time limited by sub-division (2) of Article IV. of the Ilkeston Order, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 17) Act, 1913, for the continuance in force of the provisions of that Article which enabled the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Ilkeston to borrow money by way of temporary loan or overdraft, and to utilise any sinking funds which they might have on hand for the purpose of providing temporarily during any financial year for certain current expenses was extended until the 31st day of March, 1922;

And whereas the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses have applied to the Minister of Health for an Order further extending the time limited as aforesaid for a period of one year from the 31st day of March, 1922;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 1 of the Act of 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, by this Order extends for a period of one year from the 31st day of March, 1922, the time limited as aforesaid for the continuance in force of the provisions of Article IV. of the Order.
