A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday, the Thirty-first day of January instant; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the Seventh day of February next; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the Seventh day of February next, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for shires and burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the Seventh day of February next.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Thirty-first day of *January*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the Twelfth year of Our Reign.
