"And whereas we consider that all Naval ratings should be eligible to receive the money prizes authorized by Your Order in Council of the 26th September, 1891, as payable for good shooting with revolvers or pistols to Working Petty Officers, Seamen and Stokers of the Fleet:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment as from 1st January, 1922, to Naval ratings in

vessels of Your Majesty's Navy of money prizes for good shooting with revolvers or pistols up to a total annual amount not exceeding one penny a head of authorized complement of the ship.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

acted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the question of the rates of pay and arrangements for promotion of Officers of the permanent Coastguard Cruiser Service, in view of the fact that the Fishery Protection duties hitherto performed by Coastguard Cruisers are now carried out by other vessels manned by Active Service ratings, and commanded and officered by General Service Officers borne on the Active List, and that the Officers in question are thus surplus to requirements:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the regulations set forth in the attached schedule to take effect from the 30th day of December, 1921.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

1. The following maximum establishment to be laid down for Officers of the Permanent Cruiser Service, namely:—

- 4 Chief Officers,
- 7 Senior Mates,
- 6 Second Mates.

2. Promotions to be made to these ranks within the above establishment at the discretion of the Admiralty, provided that a Senior Mate shall not be eligible for promotion to Chief Officer until he has attained six years' seniority as such, and that a Second Mate or a Chief Quartermaster shall not be eligible for promotion to Senior Mate or Second Mate respectively until he has attained 5 years' seniority as such.

3. The following rates of full pay for the ranks of Senior Mate and Chief Officer to replace those laid down in Schedule 5, Section 4, of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, namely:—

And whereas by Section 5 of the said Act it is provided that the said appointed day shall be the First day of January, nineteen hundred and nine, or such other day not being more than twelve months later, as the Board of Trade may appoint:

And whereas the Board of Trade have appointed the First day of October, 1909, to be the day after which the provisions of the Principal Act relating to life-saving appliances shall apply to all foreign ships while they are within any port of the United Kingdom as they apply to British ships:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the provisions in force in Belgium relating to life-saving appliances are as effective as the provisions of Part V. of the Principal Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the provisions of Sections 427 to 431 of the Principal Act shall not apply to any Belgian ship while within any port of the United Kingdom, if it is proved that the aforesaid Belgian provisions relating to life-saving appliances are complied with in the case of that ship.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Bulgaria the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the Commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 5th day of December, 1921, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-section (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section 1 (b).

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 4 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, it is provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, extend, with any necessary modifications and exceptions, any of the provisions of the said Act to any British possessions other than those mentioned in the Schedule to the said Act and (save as therein provided) to any territory under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas it is expedient to extend certain provisions of the said Act to certain British Colonies and Protectorates:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers on this behalf by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Air Navigation (Colonies and Protectorates) Order in Council, 1922."

2. In this Order and its schedules

"Colony" means one of the British possessions or protectorates mentioned in the second schedule hereto;

"Governor" means the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony;

"The Act" means the Air Navigation Act, 1920.

3. The provisions of Sections 7, 8 (1), 9, 10, 11, 12 and 18 of the Act with the necessary modifications as set forth in the first schedule hereto shall be and hereby are extended to the Colonies mentioned in the second schedule hereto.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1922.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. Section 7—(1) In time of war, whether actual or imminent, or of great national emergency the Governor may, by order, regulate or prohibit, either absolutely or subject to such conditions as may be contained in the Order, the navigation of all or any descriptions of aircraft over the Colony or any portion thereof, or the territorial waters adjacent thereto; and, without prejudice to the generality of this provision, any such Order may provide for taking possession of and using for the purposes of His Majesty's naval, military or air forces any aerodrome or landing ground, or any aircraft, machinery, plant, material or things found therein or thereon, and for regulating or prohibiting the use, erection, building, maintenance or establishment of any aerodrome, flying school, or landing ground, or any class or description thereof.

(2) The Order may provide for the imposition of penalties to secure compliance with the Order, not exceeding imprisonment for a term of six months and a fine of two hundred pounds and may authorize such steps to be taken in order to secure such compliance as appear to the Governor to be necessary.

(3) Any person who suffers direct injury or loss, owing to the operation of an Order of the Governor under this section, shall be entitled to receive compensation from the Governor from such public funds as he may lawfully apply for the purpose, the amount thereof to be fixed, in default of agreement, by an arbitrator to be agreed upon or failing agreement to be appointed by the Chief Justice or other Chief Judicial Officer of the Colony.

Provided that no compensation shall be payable by reason of the operation of a general Order under this section prohibiting flying in the Colony or any part thereof.

(4) An Order under this section may be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order made by the Governor.

2. Section 8—(1) The Governor shall have power to establish and maintain aerodromes (including power to provide and maintain roads and approaches, buildings and other accommodation and apparatus and equipment for such aerodromes) and to acquire land for that purpose by agreement or in accordance with the provisions of the law in force in the Colony relating to the acquisition of land for public purposes.

3. Section 9—(1) No action shall lie in respect of trespass or in respect of nuisance, by reason only of the flight of aircraft over any property at a height above the ground, which, having regard to wind, weather, and all the circumstances of the case is reasonable, or the ordinary incidents of such flight, so long as the provisions of this Order and any other Order made under the Act and extended to the Colony are duly complied with; but where material damage or loss is caused by an aircraft in flight, taking off, or landing, or by any person in any such aircraft, or by any article falling from any such aircraft, to any person or property on land or water, damages shall be recoverable from the owner of the aircraft in respect of such damage or loss, without proof of negligence or intention or other cause of action, as though the same had been caused by his wilful act, neglect or default, except where the damage or loss was caused by or contributed to by the negligence of the person by whom the same was suffered.

Provided that, where any damages recovered from or paid by the owner of an aircraft under this section arose from damage or loss caused solely by the wrongful or negligent action or omission of any person other than the owner or some person in his employment, the owner shall be entitled to recover from that person the amount of such damages, and in any such proceedings against the owner the owner may, on making such application to the court and on giving such undertaking in costs as may be prescribed by rules of court, join any such person as aforesaid as a defendant, but where such person is not so joined he shall not in any subsequent proceedings taken against him by the owner be precluded from disputing the reasonableness of any damages recovered from or paid by the owner.

(2) Where any aircraft has been *bonâ fide* demised, let, or hired out for a period exceeding fourteen days to any other person by the owner thereof, and no pilot, commander, navigator, or operative member of the crew of the aircraft is in the employment of the owner, this section shall have effect as though for references to the owner there were substituted references to the person to whom the aircraft has been so demised, let, or hired out.

4. Section 10—(1) Where an aircraft is flown in such a manner as to be the cause of unnecessary danger to any person or property on land or water, the pilot or the person in charge of the aircraft, and also the owner thereof, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that the aircraft was so flown without his actual fault or privity, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

For the purposes of this section, the expression "owner" in relation to an aircraft includes any person by whom the aircraft is hired at the time of the offence.

(2) The provisions of this section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any general safety or other regulations prescribed by Order in Council made under Part I of the Act, and extended to the Colony.

5. Section 11—The law of the Colony relating to wreck and to salvage of life or property, and to the duty of rendering assistance to vessels in distress shall apply to aircraft on or over the sea or tidal waters as it applies to vessels, and the owner of an aircraft shall be entitled to a reasonable reward for salvage services rendered by the aircraft to any property or persons in any case where the owner of a ship would be so entitled.

Provided that provision may be made by Order by the Governor with the approval of a Secretary of State for making modifications of and exemptions from the provisions of such law as aforesaid in their application to aircraft to such extent and in such manner as appears necessary or expedient.

6. Section 12—(1) The Governor may make regulations providing for the investigation in the Colony of any accident arising out of or in the course of air navigation and occurring in or over the Colony or the territorial waters adjacent thereto, or to British aircraft occurring elsewhere and likely in the absence of such provision to remain uninvestigated.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, regulations under this section may contain provisions:—

(a) requiring notice to be given of any such accident as aforesaid in such manner and by such persons as may be specified in the Order;

(b) applying, with or without modification for the purpose of investigations held with respect to any such accidents any of the provisions of any law in force in the Colony relating to the investigation of deaths or accidents;

(c) prohibiting, pending investigation, access to or interference with aircraft to which an accident has occurred, and authorizing any person, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of an investigation, to have access to, examine, remove, take measures

for the preservation of, or otherwise deal with any such aircraft;

(d) authorizing the Governor, in regard to cases where it appears to the authority conducting an investigation that a licence or certificate granted under the Act or any Order made thereunder ought to be cancelled, suspended, endorsed or surrendered, to transmit any recommendation to that effect made by the said authority for such action thereon as the Secretary of State for Air may consider just, and also authorizing the Governor pending the decision of the Secretary of State in any such cases provisionally to suspend the licence or certificate and providing for the production of any such licence or certificate for the purpose of being so dealt with.

Provided that nothing in the section shall limit the powers of any authority under sections five hundred and thirty to five hundred and thirty-seven inclusive of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or any enactment (including the Act) amending those sections.

(3) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any regulations under this section, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three months.

7. Section 18—(1) This Order shall not apply to aircraft belonging to or exclusively employed in the service of His Majesty.

Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply to any such aircraft, with or without modification, any of the provisions of this Order or of any Orders or regulations made under the Act and extended to the Colony.

(2) Nothing in this Order or in any regulations thereunder shall prejudice or affect the rights, powers, or privileges of any general or local lighthouse authority.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of Hours worked by Male or Female workers EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the Trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(b) For Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked in any week, in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, except where a higher amount is payable under Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceed 8½, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that in the case of those classes of workers in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Parishes of Blairgowrie and Rattray, the Burgh of Carnoustie or the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate specified in Sub-Section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of 8½ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable in respect of all hours worked on any such day in excess of nine hours.

Provided also that in the case of those classes of workers in the areas specified in the first proviso to this Section who, in accordance with the established practice of the establishment, attend only on five days a week the Overtime Rate specified in Sub-Section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the

first three-quarters of an hour in excess of 8½ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable on any such day in respect of all hours worked in excess of 9½ hours.

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice a FEMALE WEAVING LEARNER means a Female Worker who is:—

(a) Definitely and effectively learning weaving under the immediate instruction of a Weaving Mistress; and

(b) Employed under conditions such that she shall cease to be employed on time-work and shall be employed on piece-work at the earliest date practicable.

PART VI.

The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:—The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp;

Including:—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of

contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

|| Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 15th February, 1922.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of Male and Female Workers to apply in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on Time-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule shall be as follows:—

(a) For all Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate for all Male and Female Workers, except Apprentices as specified in Section I (A) (3) of Part I of this Schedule, shall be ONE-AND-A-HALF times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, and for Apprentices shall be ONE-AND-A-HALF times the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable under the terms of Section (1) (A) (2) of Part I of this Schedule if the worker had been registered as a Learner in Cutting and Nailing instead of as an Apprentice.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate for all Male and Female Workers, except Apprentices as specified in Section I (A) (3) of Part I of this Schedule, shall be TWICE the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, and for Apprentices shall be TWICE the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable under the terms of Section I (A) (2) of Part I of this Schedule if the worker had been registered as a Learner in Cutting and Nailing instead of as an Apprentice.

(c) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate (except in so far as the Overtime Rate payable under the provisions of Sub-section (b) of this Section is applicable) shall be for all Male and Female Workers, except Apprentices as specified in Section I (A) (3) of Part I of this Schedule, ONE-AND-A-HALF times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, and for Apprentices ONE-AND-A-HALF times the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable under the terms of Section I (A) (2) of Part I of this Schedule if the worker had been registered as a Learner in Cutting and Nailing instead of as an Apprentice.

SECTION III.—Where a worker is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule the word "Saturday" were substi-

tuted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

SECTION IV.—The Overtime Rates shall not apply to workers employed on piece-work.

Note.—The hours which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

A LEARNER is a worker who, not being an Apprentice as defined in Section II of this Part of this Schedule:—

(1) (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning (a) Cutting, or (b) Nailing, or (c) Cutting and Nailing in the Furriers' Section of the trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; or,

(b) Being a Female person, is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning (a) Machining, or (b) Lining, or (c) Finishing or more than one of these operations in the Furriers' Section of the trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(2) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

SECTION II.—AN APPRENTICE is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his or her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule for a period of five years under an Indenture of Apprenticeship to (a) Cutting, or (b) Nailing, or (c) Cutting and Nailing in the Furriers' Section of the trade in the form specified in Part IV of this Schedule, and

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of Apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I (a) (3) of this Schedule and under the special conditions for Apprentices specified in this Schedule without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his or her employment as an Apprentice the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Apprenticeship.

(iii) In cases where the number of Journeymen who have been in the service of

the employer in the branch of the Furriers' Section of the trade to which the Apprentice is bound, throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for registration, has been:—

SECTION III.—A HOMEWORKER is a worker who works in his or her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART IV.

FORM OF INDENTURE OF APPRENTICESHIP.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Apprentices set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule an Apprentice shall be employed under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the following form:—

This INDENTURE made the _____ day of _____ between _____ of _____ a minor of the age of _____ years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part, of _____ the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and _____ of _____ (hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part

WITNESSETH as follows, that is to say:—

1. The Apprentice of his or her own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself or herself to serve the Employer as his Apprentice in his trade of Furrier for a term of five years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term, and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him or her to be instructed in (a) cutting or (b) nailing or (c) cutting and nailing in the Furriers' section of the Fur Trade.

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him or her under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeywomen).

(c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of

wages as fixed by the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain) for Apprentices.

(d) That during the first three years of Apprenticeship he will not require the Apprentice to work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

(e) That if the Employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a duly qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of Furrier before the expiration of the said term of Apprenticeship, then, and in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators, as the case may be, shall, subject to the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice being first obtained, find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

(f) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which the Apprentice may spoil while learning his or her trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(g) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance or by reason of his or her attendance at School in accordance with the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employer as his Apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself or herself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such Continuation Classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires, provided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.

(e) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself or herself towards the Employer, then it shall be lawful to discharge the said Apprentice.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (including Home-workers) in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Fur) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The dressing, dyeing and making-up of furs or of skins for Furriers' purposes; including the dressing or dyeing or general preparation of furs or skins; the manufacture of furs or skins into garments, rugs, or other articles; the re-making, repairing or cleaning of articles made from furs or skins where carried on by fur dressers or fur manufacturers; the lining with fur of coats, cloaks, mantles, capes, gloves or similar articles where carried out by fur manufacturers; bundling, packing, warehousing and other operations carried on by fur skin merchants, fur dressers, fur dyers or fur manufacturers; *but excluding* the making-up of fur toys, purses, boots, shoes or slippers, the making of fur hats when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear from other materials; warehousing; packing and other similar operations carried on in shops wholly, mainly, or substantially engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

Provided that the above Minimum Rates of Wages shall *not apply* to workers employed in the dressing or dyeing, or general preparation of skins, or in the manufacture of skins into garments, rugs or other articles, *except* where such dressing, dyeing, general preparation or manufacture is carried on by fur dressers, fur dyers, or fur manufacturers, or otherwise for Furriers' purposes.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum (that is to say, lowest) Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for

the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates.
