SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES.

PREVENTION OF DUMPING.

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR COMMITTEES UNDER
PART II. OF THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUS-
TRIES ACT, 1921 (11 & 12 GEO. 5, c. 47),
DATED FEBRUARY 6TH, 1922, PRESCRIBED BY
THE BOARD OF TRADE IN PURSUANCE OF SEC-
TION 7 (3) OF THE SAID ACT.

1. The Rules of Procedure for Committees
under Part II. of the Safeguarding of Indus-
tries Act, 1921, dated September 23rd, 1921
(S.R.O. 1921, No. 1514), prescribed by the
Board of Trade in pursuance of Section 7 (3)
of the said Act, are hereby revoked.

2. If the Board of Trade decide to refer
any matter under Section 2 of the Safeguard-
ing of Industries Act, 1921, to a committee
constituted in accordance with Section 7 of the
Act, the Board will as soon as may be after
the appointment of the Committee publish in
the London, Edinburgh, Dublin and Belfast
Gazettes, or in such other manner as the Board
think proper, a notice stating—

(a) the terms of reference to the Com-
mittee:

(b) the time and place at which the Com-
mittee propose to hold their first sitting for
the taking of evidence, which shall not be
less than fourteen days after the date on
which publication of the notice is com-
pleted.

3. The Board of Trade will appoint a Chair-
man of the Committee, who shall preside at any
meeting of the Committee.

4. The sittings of the Committee at which
evidence is taken shall be held in public, except
that the Committee shall refuse to allow the
public to be present at any proceedings of the
Committee during the hearing of evidence on
matters which, in their opinion, are of a confi-
dential character.

5. The Committee shall be at liberty to take
evidence in such manner as they shall think fit.

6. Any person desiring to give evidence shall
give notice to the Secretary of the Committee,
and shall furnish, with his notice, a statement
in writing of the evidence he proposes to give.

7. The Committee shall be at liberty to
decide whether they will or will not receive the
evidence of any person who desires to give
evidence, and their decision shall be final.

8. A witness whom the Committee desire to
hear may, if he wishes, be accompanied by
solicitor or counsel who may address the Com-
mittee on his behalf, but no witness shall be
examined or cross-examined except by the
Members of the Committee.
