Interpretation.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

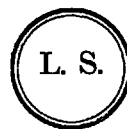

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (CHANGE
OF OCCUPATION) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) Where by reason of the termination of his right of occupation of any land

the owner of any live stock on such land is unable to remove the same therefrom by reason of any restriction of movement imposed by an Order under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, relating to foot-and-mouth disease, the person entitled to the occupation of the land on such termination aforesaid—

(a) shall afford the owner of the live stock and any person authorised by him all such facilities for feeding, tending or otherwise using the stock or for the sale of the stock as the owner thereof may reasonably require; or

(b) where the owner thereof is unable or unwilling to avail himself of such facilities, shall take all such steps as are reasonably necessary for the proper feeding, tending or otherwise using the stock.

(2) These provisions shall continue to
