"And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

"And whereas the said sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as atoresaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Saint Albans as the person to whom they desire the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints, Luton.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Michael, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, Luton, being: "All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Luton, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which is bounded upon the north and upon the north west by the New Parish of Biscot, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the Parish of Caddington, partly in the said County of Bedford and partly in the County of Hertford and wholly in the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south east and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Caddington from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, crosses the middle of the Hatfield, Luton, and Dunstable Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the eastern side of the bridge which carries Clifton Road across the said line of railway, and extending thence north eastward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the Luton Town Football Ground) for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Beech Road with the roadway running along the north eastern side of the said football ground, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Beech Road for a distance of 104 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dunstable Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Dunstable Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Leagrave Road and Bury Park Road, and extending thence first north eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Bury Park Road for a distance of 131 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Waldeck Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Waldeck Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Main Line of the Midland Railway across Waldeck Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 571 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, from the said New Parish of Biscot."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Cure out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be^{*} taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.
