And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 9th day of September, 1905, under Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the powers of the Vestry under the third and fourth Sections of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869, were conferred on the District Council:

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke, and the District Council thereof is now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part 3 of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was made by the District Council on the 16th day of March, 1903, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 25th day of June, 1903, and an Amending Scheme was made by the District Council on the 11th day of March, 1915, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 16th day of April, 1915:

And whereas on the 14th day of September, 1916, the District Council made Rules with respect to Small Holdings and Allotments in the said Urban District, and the same were confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on the 13th day of December, 1916, and are now in force within the said Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 12th day of November, 1903, made Regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops' Order of 1885 and the same are now in force within the said Urban District:

And whereas the Chairman of the District Council for the time being and one Member of the said Council are Trustees of a Charity affecting the District and known as "The Thomas King Trust Fund":
