*NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 2nd April, 1922.

This Notice takes the place of all Notices previously issued by the Trade Board fixing or varying minimum rates of wages.
