ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST MARCH 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,
 by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested
 in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
 1899 to 1914, and of every other power
 enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as
 follows:—

*Authorisation of Sales of Pedigree Bulls at
 Perth.*

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in
