LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL
(GENERAL POWERS).

(Petition for Additional Provision.)

(Power to Council of Metropolitan Borough of Paddington to Utilise for the Erection of Buildings Lands acquired for purposes of the Baths and Washhouses Acts and to Lease such Buildings; Power to Borrow Money for those purposes.)

THE London County Council intend to apply to Parliament by petition for additional provision for leave to introduce into the Bill promoted by them, and now pending in Parliament, under the title of "the London County Council (General Powers) Bill," provisions to enable the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Paddington (in this Notice called "the Paddington Council") to utilise the whole or part of certain lands in the said metropolitan borough (forming the site of the premises known as "The Lodge," Porchester Road, including Porchester Hall at the rear thereof, and Nos. 1 and 2, Porchester Houses, and being part of certain lands acquired by the Paddington Council under and for the purposes of the Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846 to 1896) for the erection of and to erect and maintain thereon a hall for the purposes of business or for public meetings, assemblies or entertainments, and shops, offices and other buildings, and to empower the Borough Council to lease or let any buildings so erected.

To empower the Paddington Council for the purposes aforesaid to borrow money and to mortgage and assign the moneys and rates authorised to be raised and levied by them, and to make provision as to the repayment of moneys so borrowed, the payment of interest thereon, and the adjustment of accounts.

To provide that the costs, charges and expenses incidental to the promotion of the Bill, in so far as it relates to the additional provision, shall be paid by the Paddington Council out of the general rate leviable by them.

To apply with or without modification for the purposes aforesaid or to render inapplicable all or any of the provisions of the Metropolitan Management Act, 1855, and any Act amending the same, the Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846 to 1896, or any other Act.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges and to repeal or amend any Acts which would be inconsistent or might interfere with the objects or purposes of the additional provision, and to confer other rights and privileges.
