PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of the Roads Act, 1920, that provision may be made by Order in Council for the discharge by the Minister of Transport or otherwise of the functions under the said Act and the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, of any County Council in Ireland which in the opinion of the Minister neglects or refuses to perform any of those functions and for carrying the provisions of the aforesaid Roads Act or of any such Order or any other Order under that Act into effect as respects the area of such County Council:

And whereas by the Road Vehicles (Defaulting Councils) (Ireland) Order, 1921, it was provided that the functions under the Roads Act, 1920, and the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, of the County Councils of each of the Counties named in the Schedule to the Order should, subject to the provisions contained in the said Order, be discharged by the Police Authority as defined in the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by

and with the advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Defaulting Councils) (Ireland) Revocation Order, 1922.

2. As from the 1st day of April, 1922, the provisions of the Road Vehicles (Defaulting Councils) (Ireland) Order, 1921, shall be and the same are hereby, revoked.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, that as from such date or dates as His Majesty in Council may by Order determine there shall be transferred to the Minister of Transport all powers and duties of any Government Department in relation to—

- (a) Railways.
- (b) Light Railways.
- (c) Tramways.
- (d) Canals, Waterways and Inland Navigations.
